

City of Loganville – Roll-off/Container Permit Requirements

All persons, contractors, and agencies must obtain a Roll-off/Container Permit before placing any roll-off, trailer, container, or similar structure on City-owned property or within the City right-of-way, including areas that would make parking spaces, sidewalks, or other public areas unavailable for use.

All permit applications must be submitted to the City of Loganville Sanitation for review and routing to other applicable City departments. Approval is required prior to placement of any roll-off or container on City property or within the right-of-way.

Permits issued under this program are **valid for a maximum of 90 days**, after which the applicant must reapply if continued placement is needed.

Fees and Conditions

- A \$50 application fee is required for each permit.
- In addition to the application fee, the daily rate for occupying City right-of-way or City-owned parking spaces are \$2.00 per equivalent parking space per day, whether marked or unmarked.
- Fees must be paid in cash, credit card, by check, money order, made payable to City of Loganville.

Payments may be submitted at City Hall during normal business hours.

Application Review Process

Once the completed application and fee are received, the City of Loganville Sanitation will coordinate review with other relevant departments.

- The proposed placement location may be inspected to ensure it does not interfere with safe vehicular or pedestrian movement.
- The Fire Marshal may review the site to ensure emergency access is maintained.
- Staff will confirm that the placement does not obstruct collection routes or City operations.

If the requested location is not suitable, an alternate placement area will be recommended and coordinated with the applicant.

Minimum Requirements

- Roll-offs or containers shall not be placed within or near the City right-of-way in a manner that impedes, restricts, or interferes with the flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic. Any placement that creates a traffic hazard or obstructs visibility is strictly prohibited.
- The applicant is responsible for protecting paved surfaces during loading and unloading operations. Three-quarter-inch (3/4") plywood is required under all runners when a roll-off/container is placed on pavement. The applicant will be held liable for any damage caused by placement of the roll-off/container.
- Roll-offs/containers are not permitted in sidewalk areas. Use of sidewalks will only be allowed under special provision. When approved, the applicant must protect the integrity of the sidewalk and provide a temporary ramp for access.
- Roll-offs must be covered when not in use to prevent debris from blowing into the right-of-way. The surrounding City right-of-way must be kept free of debris at all times.
- Dumping materials from elevated locations requires the use of a covered chute to minimize dust.
- Roll-offs or containers placed adjacent to a roadway must be clearly visible to oncoming traffic at all times. Because the container itself cannot be modified, the applicant is required to place high-visibility traffic cones or similar traffic-control devices at each corner of the roll-off or container. Cones must be equipped with reflective red and white diagonal tape (minimum six inches (6") wide and twenty-four inches (24") long) to ensure nighttime visibility.
- The applicant assumes all liability and agrees to hold harmless the City of Loganville from any and all claims, damages, suits, penalties, fines, or losses arising from or related to the placement of a roll-off or container within the City right-of-way or on City-owned property.
- The applicant must ensure the issued permit is displayed in a clearly visible location near the permitted roll-off or container, such as on a stake, post, fence, or other nearby structure. The permit must remain unobstructed and easily viewable from the public right-of-way for the duration of the placement.
