**A RESOLUTION GOVERNING THE TALLY OF WRITE-IN VOTES FOR  
CITY OFFICES IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS**

**WHEREAS**, Minnesota Statute 204B.09, subdivision 3 allows for the governing body of a statutory City to adopt a Resolution governing the counting of write-in votes for local elective office; and

**WHEREAS**, the current write-in vote counting process is overly time consuming and unnecessary; and does not change election results unless a single write-in candidate receives the most votes for an office.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the City Council of the City of Long Lake, Hennepin County, Minnesota does hereby require that write-in votes for candidates will only be tallied and individually recorded if the total number of write-in votes for that office is equal to or greater than the fewest number of non-write-in votes for a candidate on the ballot.
