## RESOLUTION NO. 2024-\_\_\_\_\_

### RESOLUTION ADOPTING A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 FUNDED BY SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017

**WHEREAS**, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

**WHEREAS**, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of our City of Los Altos are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Los Altos must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Los Altos, will receive an estimated \$820,161 in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2024-2025 from SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, this is the seventh year in which the City of Los Altos is receiving SB 1 funding and will enable the City of Los Altos to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Los Altos has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/the project list; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Los Altos used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the communities priorities for transportation investment; and

**WHEREAS**, the funding from SB 1 will help the City of Los Altos maintain and rehabilitate 44 roads throughout the City of Los Altos this year and hundreds of similar projects into the future; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2023 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the City of Los Altos' streets and roads are in an at-risk condition and this revenue will help us increase the overall quality of our road system and over the next decade will bring our streets and roads into a "excellent" condition; and

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**WHEREAS**, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

**NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND** by the City Council of the City of Los Altos, State of California, as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.
2. The following list of newly proposed projects will be funded in-part or solely with Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account revenues:

<b>TS-01006</b>	Traffic Sign Replacement	Design and upgrade existing street signs to meet current signing traffic sign and reflectivity requirements, and maintain existing traffic signals, street lights, and pedestrian crossing apparatus.	Various locations in the City	June 2025	New sign usually has a useful life of 10 years

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<b>TS-01008</b>	ADA Improvements (Streets and Roadways)	Design and upgrade existing ADA ramps at various locations to meet current ADA standards	Various locations in the City	June 2025	Usually have a useful life of 50 years
