The city paid a consultant about \$75,000 to write a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan (CAAP): https://tinyurl.com/LACAAP

Potential Impact of Gas to Electric

 Los Altos would require ~ 1,000 years of zero emissions to offset the volume of global GHG emissions generated in a single day. No matter what Los Altos does with C02 emissions, it will have negligible impact.

- Replacing natural gas in the home with electricity simply diverts
 the CO2 emission issue to power plants, of which 79% run on
 fossil fuels nationwide. According to the California Energy
 Commissions' February 2020 report, 63% of CA's power is
 NOT from renewables. Natural gas is the fossil fuel that
 produces the fewest CO2 emissions.
- According to the CA Air Resources Board, residential use counts for only 8% of greenhouse gas emissions and commercial 6%, compared to industrial 24% and transportation 41%.

Los Altans surveyed do not want a ban on natural gas

- A July 2022 survey by Los Altos Residents (LAR) had 427 respondents (95% homeowners) who overwhelmingly indicated they do not support a ban on natural gas. See https://www.losaltosresidents.org/reach-codes-2022
- The EC conducted its own survey, in spite of telling Council at the June 12 council meeting: "... we in the subcommittee don't have the expertise to design a survey that's going to be seen as providing a really good data set, ... writing the questions in a proper way to ... have the information we need that we can ... rely on..." (Click here to see recorded council meeting video at 55:16-55:43 minutes) In fact, the EC survey did not ask about most of the recommendations in the CAAP. Only 51% of the respondents identified as "property owners." And in its own survey, half of the respondents do NOT support the EC's proposed gas bans. Click here

Council members,

I generally support the conversion from direct use of fossil fuels such as gas to electricity, and have switched from a gas furnace to an electric heat pump for my home within the past year. However, I am concerned that our electrical infrastructure is not up to the task.

Much of Los Altos is served by obsolete 4-kilovolt transmission lines from electric substations to the pole transformers outside our homes and businesses. This service was sufficient in the past, but our electricity needs have grown dramatically since that service was installed, due to the building of bigger homes, installation of heat pumps and air conditioning, and the increased use of electric vehicles. Under load, these 4-kilovolt lines cause significant voltage drop, while newer 12-kilovolt service has 1/9 the voltage drop.

In Monday's high temperatures, line voltage at my home dropped in the late afternoon below 100 volts (see graph below). PG&E's own specifications call for a range of between 114 and 126 volts. As a result of the low voltage, my solar inverter shut down and could not contribute to our energy needs. Low voltages also are hard on some devices, particularly motors. This is not an isolated incident; we have observed significant low voltage conditions in 2017, 2019, and 2020.

I would like for the City to apply pressure on PG&E to promptly upgrade our electric infrastructure to current standards, and then implement incentives and mandates (such as Reach Codes) to accelerate electrification only when our electrical infrastructure can support that.

- 2. Replace ALL broken/end of life gas appliances including furnaces, ACs, gas ranges/ovens, and water heaters with electric.
- 3. Replace ALL gas appliances including furnaces, ACs, water heaters with electric before you can sell your house.

My wife, Margriet and I have been living in Los Altos for 35 years. We enjoy participating actively in this great community.

My (Willem's) education and entire professional career has been in the field of Electrical Engineering.

To convert a broken water heater or furnace to electrical equipment, it would require installation of new electrical supply wires, we would also need need to upgrade our electrical panel and add new circuit breakers. This would most likely involve an upgrade for our current 125A main panel by requesting approval from PG&E to supply our home with new upgraded electrical supply lines to allow 200A to our home. This involves paying for digging a trench from the main supply to and paying for a new electrical panel in the back of our home. In addition we would need to install new wiring to all the new electrical appliances.

This all could cost us in excess of \$70,000.00. In addition, we would need to WAIT un il all of this would be completed (at least 3 months and maybe more when many households would need to do this at the same time).

Imaging having to live without a hot water heater for such an extended period!!

The cost of any of these policy proposals are enormous for homeowners like us!!

In the light of the tremendous inflation we are facing at this time, and living off of a modest retirement income, we would ask you to please reject these proposals! We don't deserve these requirements and proposals as residents.

Recently I have experienced a bit of costly conversions at our home, as we decided to go to "green" energy generation.

We have decided to install solar panels with a capacity of 6KW, costing us around \$23,000 on our own, to help us transition into a more sustainable energy supply for our current and future electrical cars.

If you would want to do some hing for the environment, you might want to ban wood burning fireplaces and offer financial incentives to residents who would convert these to electrical heating systems.

I am adamantly opposed to all Reach Codes especially the commission-proposed Reach Code to eliminate natural gas appliances from new construction, major remodels, and gas appliance replacements. To ban homeowners from an energy source that is literally right in front of their home is a penalty that our city council must reject. Several surveys have shown that the majority of Los Altos residents do not want their natural gas taken away. As elected officials, our council members need to listen to their constituents.

Not only is natural gas the cleanest of fossil fuels, it is also an affordable source of energy that is literally right at our doorstep. Why rob residents of that resource? Instead of going straight to the "stick", why not extend the "carrot" by reducing permit fees for those homeowners who elect to abandon natural gas at their street and go with all-electric appliances?

As standard building codes are being proposed, planned, revised, and ultimately voted on, a cost analysis it performed to make sure the benefit outweighs the cost and that the cost does not put an undue burden on the average property owner. Has a legitimate cost analysis been performed by professionals to determine how much switching to electric will cost versus sticking with affordable natural gas appliances? I doubt it. I suspect the commissioners just want their city to be on "the bleeding edge" and don't really care how much of a financial burden is placed on someone who wants to final rebuild, remodel, or just replace that broken gas appliance. Not all Los Altos residents are millionaires. Many are senior citizens living on a fixed income. Does our commission and council want those residents to go without a cooktop, range, furnace, or water heater simply because they can't afford the triple or quadruple cost to convert from gas to electric? Many older homes do not have the capacity to just add another 50A or 60A dedicated circuit to the existing 100A or 120A main service panel.

It seems that every change made by our state politicians is a restriction and that each restriction requires that we Californians accept a lower standard of living. California already has the strictest Green Codes in the nation. Don't add more unnecessary restrictions on those of us who choose to remain in this city by adding burdensome Reach Codes to the already expensive CALGreen Codes. I'd recommend our city council adopt and implement California's mandatory CALGreen Codes every three years and forgo adding Reach Codes. Let the state drive the codes.

Please stop wasting time on REACH codes to ban natural gas in homes and force an all-electric conversion. You ignore the complete economic picture to a homeowner by ignoring the true cost of conversion. If an electric panel must be upgraded, it's likely at a cost of \$2K to \$5K as well as the operating cost with electricity being 3x more expensive per unit of heat than gas. As a long time Los Altos resident who has added solar electric, solar pool heat, ultra high efficiency water heaters, very efficient home heaters, extra insulation, modern windows, etc during our remodels, in order to minimize our electric and gas consumption, I would encourage the council not to require that appliances be replaced with electric in new or remodeled construction.

The concept is severely flawed for several reasons:

- 1. Our current grid capacity cannot support today's demand, let alone the additional demand that would be required by all electric houses.
- 2. Our current electric grid relies predominantly on natural gas and fossils fuels to produce electricity. Natural gas/fossil fuels are a very inefficient way to produce electricity, but a very efficient way to heat things. As a result, requiring electronic homes will in actuality burn more natural gas and fossil fuels than a regular gas home.
- 3. Out current grid will not be sufficiently 'off' of natural gas and onto renewables or nuclear for, at best, another twenty years. So requiring electric homes will continue to burn more natural gas and fossil fuels for the foreseeable future.
- 4. When electricity is more cost effective than gas for producing heat, people will naturally move the to electricity, so there is no need to mandate their move.

I also understand that the council is considering redefining a remodel at greater than 50% of the current square footage. The state taxing agency only counts a new house as a newly built house. If you keep even one wall of the old house, it is classified as a remodel. Changing the Los Altos definition will only cause problems with optimally designing the house for the owners needs - which might also include energy efficiency. Keep the remodel definition where it has always been. Any wall kept, and it's a remodel, not new construction.

In addition, I understand the the council is considering adding a fee for households that continue to use a gas hook up. This is misguided for the reasons above.
