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# **Staff Recommendation:**

Approve the purchase of T2 for \$15,000 plus tax and Midnight Stomp Series for \$25,000 to be paid over four years

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### **Purpose**

To consider the purchase of two public artworks

# **Background**

One of the primary roles of the Public Arts Commission (PAC) is to administer the public outdoor sculpture program. As part of this program, the PAC routinely issues calls for art to solicit new sculptures to be loaned to the City. Sculptures that are installed as part of these calls are typically loaned to the City for two years. From time to time, these loans will be extended as approved by the PAC. In addition, the PAC will also recommend to the City Council regarding the acquisition of permanent pieces for the City's collection.

Two artworks, *T*2 and Midnight Stomp Series, were installed as part of the City's Sculpture Loan Program. The PAC recommends that the City purchase these pieces.

### **Discussion/Analysis**

The Midnight Stomp Series by Pokey Park is a series of three sculptures, *Electric Slide, Midnight Serenade Pose 2*, and *Twist & Shout*. These sculptures were installed in 2015 near 160 First Street. The artist has offered to sell all three sculptures for a total of \$25,000 to be paid over four years.

T2 by artist Charles Gadeken was installed in 2021 outside of the Los Altos Community Center. The artist has offered to sell the sculpture to the City for \$15,000 plus tax.

The PAC voted unanimously to recommend the City purchase both pieces. The budget for the Annual Public Arts Project includes dollars for the purchase of the sculptures. Public Art Fund dollars will be used for the purchases.

### **Options**

1) Approve the purchase of both pieces

Advantages: The City would retain two works of art and add them to the City's

permanent public art collection

**Disadvantages**: The City would be responsible for future maintenance of the pieces. This

maintenance is anticipated to be minimal.

2) Approve the purchase of one piece

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Subject: Public Art Purchases: T2 and Midnight Stomp Series

Advantages: The City would retain one of the works of art and add it to the City's

permanent public art collection

**Disadvantages**: The City would be responsible for future maintenance of the piece. This

maintenance is anticipated to be minimal.

3) Do not approve the purchase of either piece

**Advantages**: None identified

**Disadvantages**: The City does not add these artworks to the City's permanent collection.

### Recommendation

The staff and Public Arts Commission recommend Option 1.

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
