## B. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

## D. PRESENTATION

### 1. Presentation of Certificate of Achievement for Excellence Financial Reporting.

The City presented the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting, recognizing 17 years of strong financial management and transparency. The City Manager noted past financial challenges in the early 2000s and credited conservative budgeting and teamwork for restoring stability, thanking department heads, staff and the city council. Finance Director Pablo Garza and his team Edith Ramirez, Monica Palmero, Gracie Garcia, Jasmine Leal, Sandra Cantu, and Dora Yanez were honored for their role in maintaining compliance and accountability. The award reflects the City's commitment to sound financial practices that enable continued growth and service to residents.

### 2. Presentation by Southmost Regional Water Authority.

The Southmost Regional Water Authority (SRWA) provided an update to the City of Los Fresnos on its desalination plant operations and future plans. SRWA, which Los Fresnos owns 2.28% of, currently supplies about half of the city's water and previously provided 100% during a plant rehabilitation in 2023. The plant draws brackish water from deep underground and treats it through reverse osmosis, producing up to 7.5 million gallons per day, with optimization underway to reach 10 MGD. SRWA plans to double capacity to improve drought resiliency, but the combined cost of optimization and expansion is estimated at \$223 million, prompting efforts to secure federal and state funding rather than burden ratepayers. The authority emphasized its regional approach, environmental benefits, and collaboration with other entities, while inviting feedback from Los Fresnos on priorities and future water strategies.

## E. PUBLIC HEARING

1. Public hearing to receive comments from residents concerning an appeal on the Planning and Zoning Commission's denial for a variance of the length of the cul-de-sacs within the proposed Falcons Landing Subdivision exceeding required maximum length of 600 ft.

Public hearing opened 6:35 pm

The City of Los Fresnos held a public hearing to receive comments on the Planning and Zoning Commission's denial of a variance request for cul-de-sac lengths exceeding the 600-foot maximum in the proposed Falcon Landing subdivision. Residents expressed concerns about traffic congestion and safety on Henderson Road, flooding risks, and maintaining neighborhood standards, while emphasizing support for city growth if infrastructure improvements accompany development. Others stressed the importance of upholding zoning ordinances to ensure fairness and prevent precedent for future exceptions. Supporters of the variance argued that longer cul-de-sacs fit the property design, enhance privacy, and align with past variances granted in nearby subdivisions, noting the project's potential to generate significant tax revenue, improve drainage, and fund road upgrades. The developer highlighted the gated community's private maintenance, strict HOA standards, and environmental features, requesting reconsideration of the variance to allow the project to proceed.

The developer addressed these issues, citing traffic capacity studies, drainage improvements, and added amenities such as parks. Council members discussed emergency access, prior variances, and the benefits of the proposed design. After deliberation, a motion was made and seconded to approve the variance request.
