Los Gatos Town Council,

As a lifelong, 51 year member of the Los Gatos community I am writing to express my concern with regard to traffic safety along Blossom Hill Road and the Belwood-Belgatos Neighborhood.

I have not only live in Belwood for 15 years, I grew up on Francis Oaks Way just up Blossom Hill Road. I have spent my entire life pulling out onto Blossom Hill Road. I have never experienced traffic so bad in terms of how fast people drive and how unsafe it is for bikers, pedestrians, motorists and especially the residents living along this road.

I now have teenage drivers and after the recent fatality near our home, I have told them to not make a left across Blossom Hill Road to exit our neighborhood at Westhill Drive because a large truck is always parked along the houses on BH Road and it makes it impossible to see oncoming traffic to the left. This is also where the road goes from one to two lanes and people speed up and pass each other. There is no U turn sign at the light at Leigh and Blossom Hill intersection so, I now have my children and I doing illegal u-turns just so we do not have to take a dangerous, blind left hand turn out onto Blossom Hill Road and face an accident or death.

Having no parking allowed along Blossom Hill Road from Union Ave to Harwood Road and having a dedicated turn lane along the entire length of roadway would make our entire corridor a much safer place for all who utilize this extremely busy and well utilized road. Also adding a "do not block" section at Westhill Drive before and after the light at Leigh on Blossom Hill Road would allow for safer entering and exiting traffic during commute hours.

As a little back history, I have been working on behalf of our Belgatos/Belwood neighborhood to get safer bike paths, sidewalks and road safety for the past 15 years. I have worked with the Parks and Public Works (Kevin Rohani), town traffic engineers, the mayors at the time (Rob Rennie and Joe Pirzynski), the LGPD and the town council to no avail. I was always told the area doesn't serve enough residents to warrant any changes. My main goal was to get a side walk or path along the hillside of Blossom Hill Road from Heritage Oaks to the Union Avenue light so my children could walk to Union Middle School safely and for us to be able to walk to the Safeway shopping center on Union Ave so we did not have to drive. Over the past few years I have tried to get parking along this roadway prohibited and traffic mitigation addressed, again to no avail.

Since I have been a 51 year resident of this town, I have seen all of the traffic, bike and pedestrian safety measures the town has invested in in every part of town that serves the local LGUSD schools. East Los Gatos has been largely overlooked and forgotten. The 25 million dollar pedestrian overcrossing being built over highway 17 near blossom hill road is another example of items that

precede our needs. We already have Blossom Hill Overpass as a bike and pedestrian crossing as well as the pedestrian crossing into old town from the high school and the Main Street overpass.

The dangerous condition of the traffic pattern along Blossom Hill Road has long contributed to an elevated risk of serious injury or death — not just for residents of the neighborhood, but also for families visiting our beautiful park, playground, hiking trails and school.

Over the years there have been many serious accidents on this stretch of Blossom Hill Road. Sadly, the deadly accident that occurred on January 8th is just the latest.

Unless something is done to improve traffic safety along Blossom Hill Road and the Belwood-Belgatos community, risk to life and limb will continue to be the daily norm.

I am a faculty member at San Jose State University, an anthropologist of Silicon Valley, and a longtime collaborator with New Museum Los Gatos, NUMU. My colleagues, such as the late Pat Dunning, and I have worked with the Forbes Mill History Museum of Los Gatos since the early 2000s. As you know their collections moved to NUMU. In 2017, I worked with them on the exhibit Cement Prairie, capturing the stories of Native American relocated to the Bay Area. I am working with them now on their collaboration with the Muwekma Tribe of the San Francisco Bay Area and Mosaic America. I am writing today to encourage you to treat NUMU | New Museum Los Gatos as an integral part of its strategic priorities by removing rent payments from NUMU's lease with the Town of Los Gatos.

The institution is a vital part of the region's ecosystem of museums. They are a leader in museum studies and they amplify the voices of artists not usually recognized. They take the time to learn about the communities with which they work, such as our region's Native Americans. I have watched them mentor dozens of San Jose State University students over the years, and hope they will be in a strong position to mentor them in the future. I'm aware that NUMU is asking the Town to reduce rent for 106 E. Main Street to \$1 per year to support NUMU's ongoing responsibility to maintain and steward the Town of Los Gatos' history collection and provide art, history, and cultural educational services to the Los Gatos community. What would Los Gatos be without NUMU? I fully support this arrangement and hope that the Town can financially prioritize NUMU for years to come.



Town Manager Prevetti,

Thank you for reaching out to the town citizens for input on traffic safety.

In addition to the traffic safety issues along Blossom Hill Road that were highlighted previously in the Verbal Comment time of the 1/17 Town Council meeting, I do have five observations for my immediate neighborhood I thought would share for your visibility.

- 1. Excessive speed along Belgatos Rd. This is a 0.3 mile stretch of uninterrupted straight road without stop signs or any speed mitigation. The northbound direction is also a downhill slope (-3%) On weekdays most of the traffic is going to and from Mulberry School by parents dropping their kids off as part of their commute. On weekends we have many visitors to the park (see item 5).
- 2. J-walking. The location of crosswalks (Leigh and Harwood) is simply not convenient for school kids or pedestrians traveling to our park. The existing traffic pattern on BHR lends itself to an increase in J-walking.
- 3. Crosswalks at the corner of Belgatos & Belvue are almost always overlooked by motorists. Relating to item (1) above, cars are also typically traveling above the speed limit. I live here at the corner of this intersection and make this frequent observation.
- 4. The stop sign at Belwood Gateway and Harwood is frequently ignored, especially by motorists on Harwood and particularly by those traveling downhill in the northbound direction.
- 5. Parking at the Belgatos park is limited. My observation is that the park became more popular during the pandemic. As such, parking always spills out onto the surrounding streets on weekends. Parking capacity is maybe only ~35% of peak demand.

The PDF attached contains information on the five items discussed above, as well as the previously-communicated item regarding Blossom Hill Road.




# Belwood-Belgatos Traffic | Additional Observations



- Excessive speed very common.

  0.3 mile stretch straight stretch
  (-3% grade) of residential road
  without a stop sign. Lots of traffic
  connecting to Belgatos Park and
  Mulberry School.
- J-walking. School kids crossing to/from School (Leigh, Noddin, Union). Hikers and recreational users of the Belgatos Park
- Disregard for cross-walks. Cars driving fast up and down the street often disregard cross-walks, imperiling pedestrians.
- Running of stop sign. Cars in the North-South direction frequently run the stop sign. Cars traveling northbound are coming down a hill and usually at high speed.
- Limited parking. The park has become more popular of the years and weekend traffic almost always spills out onto surrounding streets.


# Belgatos-Belwood Traffic | Additional Observations

## BHR & Belwood Traffic Safety | Traffic Flow



- Four primary access points from the neighborhood to BHR: (1) Westhill, (2) Belgatos, (3) Belwood Gateway, & (4) Harwood
- Three-of-four access points have zero traffic controls against BHR traffic, affecting the majority of the neighborhood
- BHR is a 4-lane cross-traffic road with no turning lane or demarcated shoulder for bikes / parking
- Only the Harwood point of access has stoplight controls, but it not convenient for the majority of the neighborhood



### (1) Westhill

- No BHR traffic controls
- 4-lane cross traffic
- No BHR turn lane
- No BHR bike lane or demarcated shoulder





### (2) Belgatos

- No BHR traffic controls
- 4-lane cross traffic

- complexity of light traffic increases
- 3 No Turning Lane
  - **(A)** There is no turning lane to aid motorists in making a left turn on to BHR
  - **(B)** Motorists taking a left from BHR to Belgatos risk being rear-ended
- 4 Limited Line-of-Sight
  - vegetation and parked cars obstruct view of oncoming traffic from the left.
  - concurrent left/right turning (two cars turning at once) limits visibility for both cars
- 5 Poor or Non-existent Shoulder Markings
  - Bicyclists face multiple hazards:
  - Navigating parked cars without being struck from behind
  - Impulsive drivers turning from Belgatos who are trying to execute a stressful turn

Saw the post on next door for suggestions and I have one.

Many cars speed up on blossom hill in the long wide straightaway between winterbrook and Lu Ray. There are regularly speeds of 45 to 50+ mph on this section by cars going either direction, easily seen with the radar signs already in place.

It looked like there was a device measuring speed (not sure) near Stephenie lane recently, but this was right by the turn where people finally slow down or are just speeding up (depending on direction traveling).

If a crosswalk similar to the one on blossom hill and Hillbrook were built at Linda and blossom hill, it would throttle traffic and slow these speedsters down. In addition, there are quite a few walkers out on streets in this area but the closest crosswalk is all the way down at Hillbrook. This would be a great addition that would be appreciated by the local community.

My name is Jamie Butcher and I am a member of the Los Gatos Community, a mother of 3 school aged children, and the parent coordinator for traffic and safety at Noddin Elementary School in the Union School District. I am writing to express my concern with the regard to traffic safety along Blossom Hill Road and the Belwood-Belgatos Neighborhood.

The dangerous condition of the traffic pattern along this particular section of Blossom Hill Road is sadly not new since the deadly accident a few Sundays ago. The speeding has long presented an elevated risk of serious injury and death and is in need of your immediate attention.

In the past couple of years there have been lengthy conversations of how to keep our students and families in the Belwood-Belgatos neighborhood safe, especially since returning to in-person school back in the 2021-2022 school year. Aside from the concern for the Blossom Hill/Harwood intersection, the amount of speeding and red-light running that occurs on a daily bases from Leigh to Harwood is out of control.

At the beginning of year, I spoke to Police Sergeant Greg Borromeo and discussed some options for traffic safety. We were able to get two crossing guards and a change in our light at Harwood and Blossom Hill to help aid the students walking/biking to school and every once in awhile had LGPD ticketing. However, that does not help with the speeding that occurs and the families that drive, kids that bike, or students that walk to school from other exits of the neighborhood. In addition, the amount of traffic we have coming from Mulberry School, Bright Horizons preschool and our beautiful Belgatos Park and trails adds to the need of additional traffic safety.

I have come to realize that I just will not risk turning left from Belgatos Road onto Blossom Hill. Families have instructed their teenagers to not make that left. How can we change that to make this safer for the drivers, our children, our bikers so we do not have another devastating injury or death in our community?

Unless something is done to improve traffic safety along Blossom Hill Road and the Belwood-Belgatos community, risk to life will continue to be the daily norm. Please help make traffic improvements on Blossom Hill Road a strategic priority.

Dear Town Council Manager,

As a long term resident of the Belwood neighborhood, I'm deeply concerned about the lack of traffic controls on Blossom hill road between intersections of Leigh Avenue and Harwood Road. Recently, we have seen a rash of serious accidents that have led to loss of life and serious injury. To prevent such incidents from recurring, I have three suggestions for improving road safety on Blossom Hill Road. I've limited my suggestions to those I believe Los Gatos can implement autonomously, and so I've limited them to the Eastbound section of Blossom Hill Road; as I understand, the Westbound half may fall under SJC jurisdiction, and may require additional cooperation between the two cities.

- 1. Paint shoulder lines on the eastbound right hand shoulder. The shoulder line will help aid drivers turning left from the neighborhood onto blossom hill road. The resulting narrower lines will also help reduce the speeds on BHR by preventing the illusion of it being a wide open highway. Please see attached a diagram of this idea (BHR improvement narrow right lane).
- 2. Provide center turn lane to aid drivers turning left into and out of the neighborhood. See attached drawing (BHR -- add turn lane).
- 3. Post speed limit signs WITH radar indicator of "Your Speed". These signs will serve a reminder to the drivers and help reduce speeds on Blossom Hill Road. Please see the drawing (BHR post speed radars) in attachment.

Dear Council Members, I am writing about the Public Safety component of the Strategic Plan to be discussed at the Council's upcoming Special Meeting. My wife and I have lived in the Town for over 40 years and our children went to school here. I am a member of the St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Mary's Church. The Society's mission is to help the poor and needy. The Society partners with volunteers at St. Mary's, United Methodist (UMC), and St. Luke's churches to help the homeless neighbors in the Town. For example UMC volunteers provide showers and St. Vincent de Paul volunteers provides laundry vouchers and cleanliness supplies for them.

Several of these homeless neighbors are physically or mentally disabled and struggle to survive. In conversation with several of these folks at UMC during the storms, I learned they lost their tents, sleeping bags, clothing and other possessions, or had them soaked, in the storms. The impact was exacerbated by the very cold nights we experienced. When we met these folks were visibly shaken, muddy and shivering. Their health and safety was and is at risk.

Where could they go to get warmth and shelter from the storms and cold? There are no warming centers in the Town. The nearest warming centers at Camden Community Center and Seven Trees Community Center were at or near capacity.

I am asking the Council to arrange a day and/or night warming center for these neighbors during severe weather emergencies. I believe that the churches would partner with the Town to establish a warming center. It should be a strategic priority as a matter of public heath and safety.

Re: Another Vehicle Accident Fatality Waiting To Happen On Blossom Hill and the Belgatos Neighborhood Roads

Dear Council Members and Town Manager:

I am Chris Tanimoto who resides on Westhill Dr. near Leigh Ave. for the past 17 years. Since 2006, I have seen traffic increase dramatically in recent years. From my perspective, the one lane to two lanes on both sides of Blossom Hill Road driving towards Leigh Ave. encourages speeding way over the designated 35 MPH speed limit. This recent fatality is a wake-up call that is waiting to happen, again!

I have to admit that there is no simple solution along this stretch of road because it involves the City of San Jose, lack of bicycle lanes, a school zone at Harwood & private grade school on Belgatos Road, businesses, and residences. In addition, the Town is projecting a \$10 million plus budget deficit.

Having stated the aforementioned, there are two proposals that I would like to present that could be cost effective, and could have an immediate impact as follows:

Speed Limit Signage: Paint a 35 Mile Speed Limit on the pavement where the one lane becomes two lanes on both sides of Blossom Hill Road and also place a flashing 35 MPH Speed Limit Sign on both sides of Blossom Hill Road(Los Gatos jurisdiction). Please note that currently there is no signage of any type in this location and also there is only one Flashing 35 MPH Speed Limit sign just before Belgatos Road. Further down where the businesses are located, there is a 25 MPH Non-Flashing sign indicating a school zone only when children are present to Harwood Road. After Harwood Road, it becomes the City of San Jose jurisdiction. There needs to be an updated analysis to determine what type of signage will help reduce the speeding and at the very least, on the Los Gatos side of the road. Of course, it would be appreciated if the City of San Jose would do the same.

### Page Two:

No Parking Vehicles Over 6 Ft. High: Instead of pursuing "red curb" restrictions to assist those drivers making a left turn out of Belgatos; this ordinance would still allow residents to park vehicles under the height limitation; which is better than restricting all vehicles. Enforcement will not be available so the residents will have to report violations, similar to the Leaf Blower Ordinance. I acknowledge that this proposal may be more than simple; however, it deserves being addressed now rather than later.
