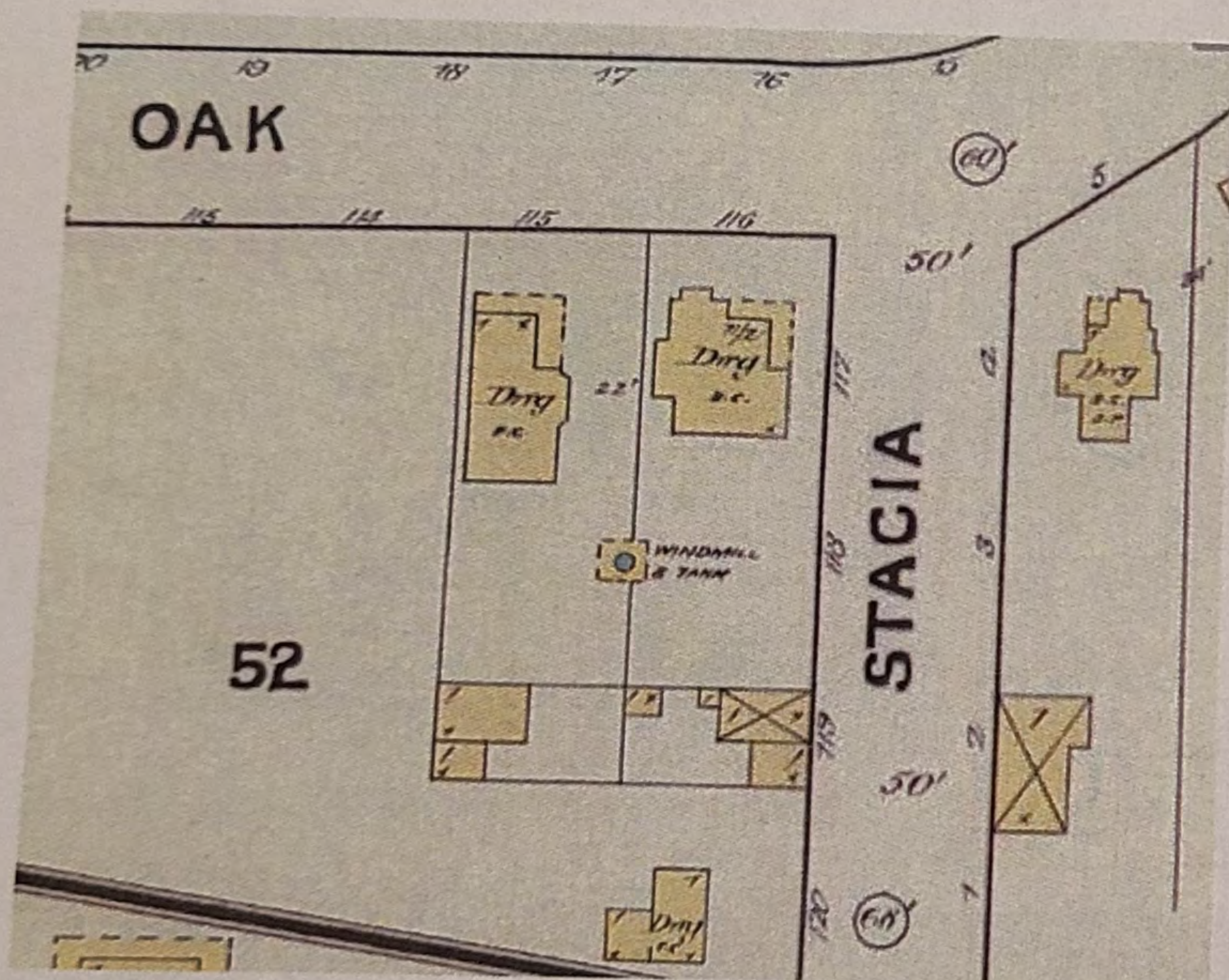

HISTORY OF 54 WHITNEY AVENUE (FORMERLY 54 OAK STREET), LOS GATOS

In 1876, the property that became 54 Whitney Avenue was included in a 76-acre tract of orchards and vineyards owned by Peter Johnson, a prominent Los Gatos businessman who became the second mayor of the town after it was incorporated in 1887. In August 1887, Peter Johnson had 38 acres of his land surveyed, platted into lots, and included in the town as "Johnson's Addition to the Town of Los Gatos."

Among the early buyers of lots in Johnson's Addition were William J. Baker and James Stanfield, both local businessmen. In November 1887, three months after the tract was platted, Baker and Stanfield jointly bought the lot at 54 Whitney, the adjacent lot at 50 Whitney, and three other lots in Johnson's Addition as investments (at that date, the addresses of the first two lots were 54 and 50 Oak Street – the street was renamed Whitney Avenue in 1925). In May 1888, William Baker sold his half interest in the lots at 50 and 54 Oak to James Stanfield.



The 1891 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map (at left) shows that, by February 1891, houses had been built on both the 50 and 54 Oak Street lots. Both buildings were ornate Victorians and appear to have been built by the same builder at the same time, between May 1888 and February 1891. The map shows that the original 54 Oak Street house had a bay window at the northwest side of the front and a wrap-around covered porch at the northeast corner. The footprint is identical to that of the current house. There was a shared water supply for the two houses, pumping water from the ground using a windmill and storing the water in a tank for later use – the windmill and water tank were on the property line between the two lots. There were outbuildings at the south ends of both lots. The largest outbuilding at 54 Oak was a stable (marked by an X on the map) bordering Stacia Street.

Both of the houses at 50 and 54 Oak were built as charming upscale Victorians, with lots of decorative trim and gingerbread both inside and out. The Bricmonts, who acquired the 54 Whitney house in 1949, had information from the previous owner that the house was built by someone named Leady or Leahy. The features of the house indicate it was built by Michael Leahy, a prominent late 19th century builder who specialized in building high-end Victorian houses in Los Gatos. The ornate trim, the wrap-around covered porch, the decorative corbels in the original parlor, the bay window, the complex roof, the use of local redwood for the framing, and the high ceilings of the interior rooms were all characteristic of Michael Leahy houses.

In April 1891, James Stanfield sold the property at 54 Oak to George Randolph Emerson and his wife Louise. George Emerson was a steam engineer who worked at the Los Gatos Ice Works. The Emersons had three sons – the two youngest were born while the family lived at 54 Oak.

In November 1902, the Emersons sold the 54 Oak Street property to William Snyder. In 1903, William also bought the adjacent lot at 112 Stacia. That lot remained undeveloped until after the last of the Snyders, William's son Irving, disposed of it a few years before he died in 1950.



54 Oak Street, photo taken about in 1903, soon after the Snyders moved into the house. The chimney at the right side of the house was the chimney for the parlor fireplace. The chimney came down during the 1906 San Francisco earthquake, and the fireplace was subsequently removed and not replaced. The other chimney would have been for the kitchen stove. The neighboring Victorian house at 50 Oak Street is visible at the right.

William Snyder led an interesting life. He was at various times in his life a schoolteacher, a merchant, a postmaster, a photographer, a farmer, a horticulturist, a physician, a coroner, and a soldier who fought for the Union during the Civil War. When William was 66 years old, for the sake of his health he moved to California with his wife Adaline Brackney Snyder and their three children – Irving, Mabel and Lula – who were young adults by that time.

William died in 1907 at age 74. His wife Adaline and their three children lived in the house together for the rest of their lives – none of the children married. Adaline died in 1926 at age 80. Mabel kept

house for the family and died in 1932 at age 58. Lula worked as a stenographer for a bank – she died in 1947 at age 68. Irving worked as a horticulturist or orchardist for most of his life and died in 1950 at age 78.

In September 1939, the head of the next family that would own the house moved into the area, when Francis Bricmont bought the next house up the street on Stacia. Francis married Theresa Faria and the couple had daughter Odette. For most of his working life, Francis was a machinist at Westinghouse in Cupertino. The Snyder and Bricmont families became close. Irving, the last survivor of the Snyders, gave the house to Theresa Bricmont in 1949, shortly before he died.

Between 1950 and 1963, the 54 Whitney house was a rental. Around 1963, Francis and Theresa Bricmont moved into the house and lived in it for the rest of their lives – Theresa died in 1985 and Francis died in 1990. The house then passed to their daughter, Odette Bricmont James, and her son, Jeffrey Bricmont Stewart. Odette and Jeffrey love the house but neither has been able to live in Los Gatos because of their careers, so it has been a rental since 1991. Thus, during the entire 136-year existence of the house, it has been owned by only three families – the Emersons, the Snyders, and the Bricmonts.

Changes to 54 Whitney over the years

When the Snyders owned the house, the bedroom at the front of the house was the parlor, the bedroom at the side of the house was the master bedroom, the bedroom at the rear of the house was shared by daughters Mable and Lula, and son Irving's bedroom was in the attic. In the parlor, there was a fireplace in the southwest corner. The chimney came down in the 1906 earthquake, and the fireplace was removed and never rebuilt.

During the years that Francis and Theresa Bricmont owned the property, there were many changes made to it, primarily to the interior of the house. Built-in bedroom closets, kitchen drawers, and kitchen cupboards were not typical in 1890s homes, and most of these features were probably added by the Bricmonts. The large bathroom was remodeled and a small second bathroom was created from what was originally the kitchen pantry. The wrap-around porch was incorporated into the living room, and the original high ceiling of the living room was lowered by adding a second ceiling below the original ceiling. The doorway between the kitchen and living room was enlarged, and the molding that was used around the doors and windows in the living room was obtained from material discarded during the demolition of the old Hotel Lyndon, a historic Los Gatos landmark that was built in 1899 and demolished in 1963.

When the Bricmonts acquired the house, there was a large metal-roofed storage room attached to the outside rear wall of the house and a small porch at the southwestern corner of the house. The storage shed and part of the porch were incorporated into the rear bedroom. Also, at some point the Bricmonts added a small storage room or den above the rear bedroom.

The outbuildings also changed considerably over the years. Sometime between 1908 and 1928, the Snyders tore down all the original outbuildings and put up a rectangular garage near the

southwestern corner of the property. Between 1908 and 1928, the Snyders also erected a small greenhouse along the fence between their property and 50 Whitney. The greenhouse was gone by 1950, and the garage was demolished in 2019.

In 2026, the house still retains many of its original features both inside and out. The roof is in its original configuration, except where a small room has been added at the back of the house above the rear bedroom. Almost all of the original exterior ornate trim has been preserved (May 2026 photo at left). In fact, the exterior is so well preserved that the Los Gatos Town Residential Design Guidelines document pictures 54 Whitney on page 52 as an example of a well-preserved Victorian dwelling. The exteriors on the sides and front of the house are original except where the original porch was incorporated into the living room. Inside the



house, many of the hallway doors have doorknobs and hinges that suggest that they are original, and the utility room door to the outside is probably original because it has an old-style door ringer. The windows in the front and side bedrooms are the original sash windows – some of the panes of glass are original, and both bedrooms retain their original picture-rail moldings. The front bedroom, which originally was the parlor, still has its original bay window, with plaster corbels featuring the face of a lovely young lady (photo at right, taken in 2025).
