

10.10.020 - Duty to obey traffic control devices and rules of the road.

- A. Any person operating a motorized foot scooter shall obey all rules of the road applicable to vehicle or pedestrian traffic, as well as the instructions of official traffic-control signals, signs and other control devices applicable to vehicles, unless otherwise directed by a police officer.
- B. No person under sixteen years of age shall operate a motorized foot scooter on a public right-of-way within the city of Lynden.
- C. It is unlawful to operate or ride a motorized foot scooter upon any sidewalk within the city of Lynden.
- D. No person shall transport or tow another person on, in or with a motorized foot scooter upon any public right-of-way within the city of Lynden.
- E. Every motorized foot scooter upon a public right-of-way within the city of Lynden at any time from a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise and at any other time when, due to insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric conditions, persons and vehicles on the public right-of-way are not clearly discernable at a distance of one thousand feet ahead, shall display a lighted headlight, a lighted stop light, lighted turn signals, and at least two illuminating reflectors of a type approved by the Washington State Patrol.
- F. Every motorized foot scooter shall be equipped with a brake that will enable the operator to make the braked wheels skid on dry, level, clean pavement.
- G. Operation of a motorized foot scooter without a muffling device, or operation with a modified muffling device is unlawful.
- H. Helmet required. Any person operating a motorized foot scooter upon any public right-of-way within the city of Lynden shall wear an approved helmet.
