# Fire Department Items

3. Chief Noonan provide the Monthly report for the Fire Department for January. There were 212 total calls, 70 of which were overlapping and 170 Aid calls. 64 hours per month is

spent on Fire Marshall items. Fire Hydrant and Life safety was performed by a light duty Lt and there were a number of community outreach events.

There will be a final inspection completed on the Quint and should be ready to go in April.

### **Police Department Items**

4. Public Safety Stats - January 2025. 777 Total calls, down from 832 last month but up from 747 last year. Thefts are back down this month.

One officer is still on extended medical leave, another is hoping to be released from medical leave to full duty next month. Officer Bierlink is in the last phase of her FTO and will be out on her own in March. Russ Martin retired in November and Randy Humphreys went through the process of being appointed as Lieutenant.
