Summary Statement:		
<p>The City Administration Department, in cooperation with Parks, Police, Public Works and Community Development Departments have been actively working on solutions for parking conflicts which have been occurring at the city parks. At times visitors park in ways that block driveways or park at city facilities overnight. It is critical that the city address these issues ahead of the busy spring and summer weekends when parking conflicts are at their worst. In addition to city parks, the proposed amendment will address parking lots at city facilities such as city hall and the Annex, city-owned lots, and public streets.</p> <p>The code amendment will be supported by the posting of signs and contracting with a towing company to enforce regulations when requested.</p> <p>The City's legal counsel is currently reviewing the attached draft ordinance in preparation for a public hearing date of February 3rd. Any edits made by legal counsel will be reflected in the final version included in the upcoming Council package as proposed Ord. 25-1705</p>
