- 1 After the War of 1812 Mackinac Island
- 2 became a center of trade, politics, and a
- 3 merging of cultures in the Great Lakes.
- 4 It was the hub of John Jacob Astor's fur
- 5 empire and at the crossroads of Great
- 6 Lakes transportation. As fur trading
- 7 declined in the 1830s, fishing continued
- 8 to thrive, and such tourists as Great
- 9 Britain's Anna Jameson wrote about
- 10 "the little fortress, snow-white, and
