 - o Requested that the City host a hazardous waste disposal weekend sooner than the usual fall date
 - o Allen Burt, Department of Public Works (DPW) Director, noted that the Solid Waste Facility does not take electric bike batteries and that the proper place to take these is to an off-island recycling facility or the fall hazardous waste collection event.
 - The DPW is currently discussing options for the collection of electric bike batteries prior to the fall
 - o Councilwoman Myers noted that the City will work with the DPW on a plan to help accommodate the disposal of electric bike batteries
