Reallocation of Fiscal Year 2022-23 and 2024-25 State of Good Repair (SGR) Funds

**Action:** Approve Resolution 22-11 Amendment No. 4, Revised Project List Fiscal Year 2022-23 and Resolution 24-11 Amendment No. 3, Revised Project List Fiscal Year 2024-25

**SUMMARY:**

The California State of Good Repair (SGR) program is administered by Caltrans and annually provides discretionary funding for transit-related capital, rehabilitation, and maintenance projects that maintain a “state of good repair” for transit systems. Regional funds are provided to MCTC for oversight, and the MCTC Policy Board allocates funds towards eligible projects. If priorities change, a modified project list can be submitted to Caltrans.

MCTC may reallocate the unused SGR funds to existing or new eligible projects. The City of Madera has proposed for consideration to reallocate unused funds: 1) Transit Enhancements - Solar Lighting (\$82,405.31), and 2) Transit Enhancements – Concrete Pads (\$117,641.28) to the City of Madera Intermodal Transit Center Renovation.

Funds reallocated to the City of Madera Intermodal Transit Center Renovation.

FY 24-25	City of Madera Transit Enhancement Concrete Pads	Enhance bus stops with cement pads to accommodate ADA/wheelchair passengers.	\$117,641.28	Madera Metro is conducting a service assessment; installation of concrete bus pads is delayed pending potential route and stop changes. Funds reallocated to the City of Madera Intermodal Transit Center Renovation.
