WHEREAS, recognizing Black History Month encourages citizens, schools, civic organizations, businesses, and faith communities to engage in activities that celebrate accomplishments, advance awareness, and promote dialogue about the continuing struggle for civil rights and social justice.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Dr. Christopher Harvey, Mayor of the City of Manor, Texas, and on behalf of the Manor City Council, do hereby proclaim the month of February 2026 as:
