Subject:	US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) FCCE PL84-99 Repairs Update
Background Information:	<p>During routine reviews of the City flood control project, City staff identified two areas of concern due to erosion along armored segments of the flood control project. Upon discovery, City staff completed aerial survey of the flood control project via drone and submitted information and a request for review to the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE). The locations of the flood control project repairs are identified in the plan pages that are included in the Council packet.</p> <p>Following review and discussions, the USACE has agreed to design and administer a repair project for our federal flood control system until Public Law 84-99. Public Law 84-99 is the Corps of Engineers' basic authority to provide support to local governments prior to, during, and after a flood event. The Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies (FCCE) appropriation provides funding for PL 84-99 authorized activities.</p> <p>The City Council has taken prior actions related to this project on November 10, 2025 and March 10, 2026. Prior actions included authorizing the USACE and its contractors to access our property to make repairs and authorizing execution of rights of access agreements with Lake Marshall Township, E-Free Church, and S&R Auto.</p> <p>On Friday, April 10, 2026, the USACE opened bids for these flood control project repairs. Two bids were received, with the low proposal being submitted by Three Oaks Construction, Inc., from North Sioux City, SD, in the amount of \$260,868. The bid is just below the engineer's estimate of \$268,392.08. The other bid was submitted by a company from Missouri in the amount of \$650,000.</p> <p>Though it takes a lot of staff time and coordination with the USACE, City staff appreciates the review and consideration of the USACE staff for these necessary flood control project repairs.</p>
Fiscal Impact:	There is no cost to the City for these repairs. All repair costs will be covered by the Federal Government under PL84-99.
