Subject:	General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024A. 1) Conduct a Public Hearing 2) Resolution approving property tax abatement to finance certain public improvements in the City
Background Information:	On December 19, 2023 the City Council Called for a Public Hearing to be held on January 9, 2024.
	At its January 9, 2024 meeting, the Marshall City Council is being asked to consider the following resolution in anticipation of the issuance of General Obligation Bonds, Series 2024A:
	Resolution approving property tax abatement to finance certain public improvements in the City
	Property tax abatement to finance certain public improvements in the City The City is proposing property tax abatement to aid in financing certain public improvements, including improvements to various city parks (Independence Park and Legion Field) (the "Project"), all pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Sections 469.1812 through 469.1815, as amended. The City intends to issue one or more series of general obligation bonds, a portion of which will be designated as tax abatement bonds, in the aggregate principal amount estimated not to exceed \$600,000 to pay the costs of the project. The abatement bonds are expected to be paid primarily through the collection of abatement revenues. Prior to approval of the granting of a property tax abatement, the City is required to hold a public hearing. The City Council has scheduled January 9 as the date of the public hearing. Following the hearing, the resolution would authorize the City to finance the identified public improvements with property tax abatements through the issuance and sale of general obligation tax abatement bonds.
