Section 86-1 Definitions

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Residential facility means:

- (a) Aany facility, licensed by the Department of Health and Human Services with the State of Minnesotacommissioner of public welfare, public or private, which for gain or otherwise regularly provides one or more individuals with a 24-hour per day substitute for care, food, lodging, training, education, supervision, habilitation, rehabilitation and treatment they need, but which for any reason cannot be furnished in the individual's own home. Residential facilities include, but are not limited to: state institutions under the control of the State of Minnesotacommissioner of public welfare, foster homes, residential treatment centers, maternity shelters, group homes, residential programs, licensed sober houses, or schools for handicapped children. Nothing in this definition shall be construed to include any facility excluded by Minn. Stat. § 462.357, subd. 7.
- (b) Any communal living facility, which, for gain or otherwise, provides one or more persons with education, support, or rehabilitation related to a disability recognized under the Fair Housing Act and which, because of the benefits of communal living, furthers their rehabilitation and access to housing, including sober houses operating in compliance with state law.
