- 1 plus (1)24-6 for new subdivisions with more than 10 vacant parcels
- 2 15 feet for a dwelling group of more than 4 units
- 3 two (2) for double frontage lots (one per frontage)
- 4 percentage of façade area; two (2) for double frontage and corner lots (one per façade)
- 5 plus (1)32-6 for a dwelling group of more than 4 units
- 6 whichever is less
- 7 per manufactured park entrance plus one (1)1-3 per occupied lot
- 8 per occupied lot
- 9 two (2) signs for double frontage lots (one per frontage, one 120 SF and another 60 SF) and for corner lots or lots with total frontage over 600 feet (one 120 SF and another 60 SF), provided distance between signs is at least 4/5 of the frontage length; two (2) signs for lots with two or more different principal use buildings (120 SF and 60 SF); for lots with frontage greater than 400 ft, single sign area may be increased to 150 SF, provided it is located at least 2/5 of the frontage length from each corner; 120 SF size limit shall be reduced to 80 SF for lots with frontage less than 100 feet and for ground sign lower than 20 feet;
  - sign areas may be increased by 25 percent for divided highway frontage and for signs located more than 20 feet above ground (cumulatively); height may be increased by 5 feet for divided highway frontage
- 10 shall not project over public right of way (except in downtown, they can project up to six feet or two/thirds of sidewalk width, whatever is less) or any driving area
