| <b>Subject:</b>                | US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) FCCE PL84-99 Repairs 2023 and 2024 - Certification of Lands and Authorization  |
| <b>Background Information:</b> | <p>During routine reviews of the City flood control project, City staff identified two areas of concern due to erosion along armored segments of the flood control project. Upon discovery, city staff completed aerial survey of the flood control project via drone and submitted information and a request for review to the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE).</p> <p>Following review and discussions, the USACE has agreed to design and administer a repair project for our federal flood control system until Public Law 84-99. Public Law 84-99 is the Corps of Engineers' basic authority to provide support to local governments prior to, during, and after a flood event. The Flood Control and Coastal Emergencies (FCCE) appropriation provides funding for PL 84-99 authorized activities.</p> <p>The locations of the flood control project repairs are identified in the plan pages that are included in the Council packet. At this time, the USACE is asking for execution of the "Certification of Lands and Authorization" document that is included in the Council packet. By executing this document, the City is acknowledging that we own the land where the project work is going to occur, and we authorize the project to proceed on our property.</p> <p>The requested certification document requires the City Attorney to sign and acknowledge that the Attorney has reviewed the title for the parcel and that the City has the authority to grant authorization for access to the property. As such, the City Attorney has reviewed the title and the City Attorney is prepared to execute the certification document.</p> |
| <b>Fiscal Impact:</b>          | No fiscal impact. City staff are not aware of any fiscal impact for the project design and construction. It is staff's understanding that the USACE will utilize its FCCE appropriation to cover the costs associated with project design, construction, and project administration.  |
