

Section 74-86 Speed Limits

1. *Certain streets.* The maximum speed limits on the following streets shall be established as follows:
 1. North Seventh Street between Redwood River Diversion Channel and Erie Road (County State Aid Highway No. 33): 50 mph.
 2. Country Club Drive between South Fourth Street and County State Aid Highway No. 7: 40 mph.
 3. Saratoga Street between the most southerly city limits line and just south of Denali Street: 40 mph.
 4. Channel Parkway between State Highway 19 and US Highway 59: 45 mph, except it shall be 35 mph northbound between State Highway 19 and Madrid Street.
2. *In mobile home park or recreational camping area.* It is unlawful for any vehicle to travel at a rate in excess of ten miles per hour while within the limits of a mobile home park or recreational camping area, and such ten-mile per hour limit shall be clearly posted throughout the mobile home park.

Section 74-91 Operation On Sidewalks

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to operate a motorized vehicle on any sidewalk.
- (b) For the purpose of this section, the term "motorized vehicle" shall include, but not be limited to such things as: cars, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, motorized carts, ATV's, utility vehicles, snowmobiles, and motorized bicycles, hoverboards, and electric scooters, except mobility scooters.

Section 74-92 Bicycle Lanes And Paths; Vehicles

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to operate a motorized vehicle within an established and officially designated bicycle lane within a roadway, path or bicycle trail across private property on which the city has acquired an easement and constructed a bicycle trail.
- (b) For the purpose of this section, the term "motorized vehicle" shall include, but not be limited to such things as: cars, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, motorized carts, ATV's, utility vehicles, and snowmobiles.

Section 74-151 Non-motorized vehicles~~Skateboards, Roller Skates, Roller Blades And Roller Skis~~

- (a) *Definitions.* The following shall be considered non-motorized vehicles and~~words, terms and phrases~~, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Bicycle means a two- or three-wheeled vehicle propelled by pedals and steered with a handlebar.

Kick scooter means a device for riding upon, usually while standing, consisting of a board and two in-line wheels, propelled by a rider pushing off the ground and steered with a handlebar.

Roller skates or roller blades means a form of skate with small wheels or rollers instead of a blade or runner.

Roller skis means a ski with small wheels attached.

Skateboard means a device for riding upon, usually while standing, consisting of an oblong ~~board~~piece of wood or other composition, mounted on four skate wheels, and propelled by a rider pushing off the ground.

- (b) *Prohibited acts.* It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a non-motorized vehicle as follows~~skateboard, roller skates, roller blades or roller skis~~:

1. On private property of another without the express permission to do so by the owner or occupant of such property.
2. In a careless, reckless or negligent manner so as to endanger or be likely to endanger, the safety of any person or property of any other person.
3. Upon a public sidewalk within the Heritage~~downtown~~ district of the city. The term "Heritage~~downtown~~ district" is defined in section 86-1.
4. By attaching a non-motorized vehicle~~a skateboard, roller skates, roller blades or roller skis~~ or ~~the person of its~~the operator to any vehicle upon a roadway.

- (c) Yielding right-of-way: The operator of a non-motorized vehicle emerging from an alley, driveway or building, upon approaching a sidewalk or the sidewalk area extending across any alleyway, shall yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians approaching on the sidewalk or sidewalk area, and upon entering the roadway, shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on the roadway.

Section 74-168 **Speed and Manner Of Riding**

It is unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the existing conditions, or to perform or attempt to perform any acrobatic or stunt riding **on a roadway**.

Section 74-169 **SpeedReserved**

~~It is unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the existing conditions, or to perform or attempt to perform any acrobatic or stunt riding.~~

Section 74-170 **Usable Paths To Be UtilizedReserved**

~~Whenever a usable path for bicycles has been provided adjacent to a roadway, bicycle riders shall use such path and shall not use the roadway.~~
