April 2026**

- Water usage for the month of April was 9.2 million gallons.
- Sewer usage for the month of April was 11.0 million gallons.
- Water usage for Fairfield Twp. for the month of April was 1.1 million gallons.

Operations

- Work orders for the month of April were (48).
- Miss Digs for the month of April was (78). All Miss Digs were reviewed and serviced as needed.
- Water meters were read, and all work orders were completed.
- All sewer reads for the month of April were submitted to the City of Adrian.
- Lift stations and generators were inspected for the month of April.
- Monthly operating report submitted to EGLE.
- Backwashing of iron filter as necessary.
- Monthly Drinking water sampling has been completed.
- Wastewater discharge sampling at water treatment plant.
- The Annual Drinking Water Sampling has been completed.

Communications

- WTP improvement project continues. One of the new water filters is scheduled to be placed into service on Monday, May 12, 2026. This will allow the existing filter currently in operation to be removed and will provide the necessary space for installation of the second new filter.
- Annual preventative maintenance and inspection of the Township's six sanitary sewer lift stations is currently in progress. All stations are scheduled to be serviced and evaluated. Any deficiencies, significant findings, or necessary repairs identified during preventative maintenance operations will be documented and addressed as appropriate.
- The Water Department has a coordination meeting scheduled for May 14, 2026, with the Ferguson Waterworks project management team regarding the upcoming water meter replacement project in the Treat Highway area between US-223 and Carleton Road.
- Annual hydrant and water main flushing operations for Madison and Fairfield Townships are scheduled to begin on May 13, 2026, and are expected to continue through June 22, 2026, as part of the annual water system maintenance program. Residents are advised to check water clarity prior to washing light-colored clothing during flushing activities. If temporary water discoloration is observed, run cold water until the water clears.
