Subject: Emergency Street Vacation Moratorium

Summary

Council Resolution No. 434 was adopted on 6.12.2023 to establish an emergency moratorium on applications seeking street vacations within the City of Medina. An initial public hearing on that intended moratorium was not timely held, rendering Resolution No. 434 of no effect.

New Council Resolution No. 438, attached hereto, will establish a new emergency moratorium effective as of the adoption date of said Resolution, and will supersede and replace Council Resolution No. 434 as of that date. The required timely public hearing date is specified in new Council Resolution No. 438 along with directives to staff regarding public notices and preparations for the public hearing.

City staff recommends adoption of Council Resolution No. 438 as attached hereto to restart the emergency street vacation moratorium process.
