The following is a summary highlighting some of the Medina Police Department activity in October, 2024.

Follow up:

Shredder/Drug Take-Back/Electronics Recycling Event:

The Medina Police Department hosted the second Shredder/Drug Take-Back/E-Cycle Day of 2024! The event was a huge success and was an outstanding opportunity to spend time with our community members.

Pro-Shred collected approximately 30 bins of documents to shred and SBK Recycling collected nearly a truckload of electronics to be recycled. The Medina Police Department turned over approximately 35 pounds of drugs to be destroyed, rendering each medication incapable of being misused or falling into the wrong hands.







2024 Great Shake Out Exercise:

On Thursday, October 17th at 10:17 a.m. the Medina Police Department and City of Medina participated along with over 57 million people worldwide in the Great Shakeout earthquake exercise. The event is an international event intended to practice earthquake safety and address any areas of concern.

Medina Elementary Walk to School Event:

On Wednesday, October 2nd, members of the Medina Police Department participated in the annual "Walk-to-School Day" with Medina Elementary School students, parents, school faculty and community members.

Walk-to-School Day is celebrated on the first Wednesday of October to bring awareness to the positive benefits of exercise. Thousands of communities join in with fun and safe Walk-to-School Day events that get families, teachers, city staff and community members walking together while educating children and families about the benefits of walking or cycling to school as well as benefiting the environment.



	 Any traffic stop that resulted in a verbal warning to the driver.
