## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The purpose of this agenda bill is to authorize Mayor Nice to sign the Joint Letter (Exhibit 1) to FEMA, seeking support of the appeal of the denial of the Washington State Major Disaster Declaration in response to the November 2024 bomb cyclone.

#### BACKGROUND

Communities in Western Washington continue to recover from the November 2024 bomb cyclone event. While Governor Inslee made the request for a Major Disaster Declaration, it has not been approved.

## **ISSUE/DISCUSSION**

The City or Mercer Island was asked to sign on to a Joint Letter (Exhibit 1) urging FEMA to support to the appeal of the denial of the federal Major Disaster Declaration following the November 2024 bomb cyclone event. Mayor Nice will add his signature to the letter on May 7, 2025 along with Mayors from other Eastside cities. At the time the City Council packet was amended, other signatures were still being gathered, and the

final version of the letter was not yet available. A final copy of the letter will be provided to the City Council as soon as it is available.

## **RECOMMENDED ACTION**

Authorize Mayor Nice to sign the Joint Letter to FEMA in support of the appeal of the denial for the Major Disaster Declaration in response to the November 2024 bomb cyclone.
