- WHEREAS,** migraine and headache disorders affect more than 40 million Americans, approximately 1 in 4 households; and,
- WHEREAS,** an estimated 4 million Americans live with chronic migraine, experiencing 15 or more days of migraine pain per month up including up to 10% of school aged children and up to 28% of adolescents; and,
- WHEREAS,** increased public awareness, improved access to care, and support for research are essential to reduce the burden of migraine and headache disorders and to improve the lives of those affected; and,
- WHEREAS,** people living with migraine disease deserve fair, equal, timely, and affordable access to new and innovative treatments to live their lives to their fullest potential.
- THEREFORE,** I, Robert E. Simison, proclaim the week of June 2026, as
