- 1. **Holiday Special Event Recruiting** Trunk or Treat and Christmas in Meridian may be far away, but I am recruiting now to ensure we have enough volunteers for these events. I am targeting large businesses in Meridian and Boise specifically for the parade.
- 2. **High School Service Clubs** This fall my goal is to go in person to high school service club meetings to promote the events for Trunk or Treat and Christmas in Meridian events, mainly the parade and children winter festival.
- 3. **Summer Events Wrap Up** Our weekly special events this summer are wrapping up in August with the movie nights bringing a consistent group of volunteers for set up and tear down.

- Facility Operations Current hours are as follows: Monday through Friday: 7:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m.; Weekends: 10:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. September 11 we will move to Monday through Friday: 7:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m.; Weekends 10:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.
 - MPR summer volleyball and 3 vs 3 basketball kicks will be done August 3.
- 2. Upcoming Facility Reservations -

Idaho Senior Games – September 8 & 9 – 1 Court. It has been communicated in a very clear manner the facility will still have a strong odor left behind from the floor resurfacing project during this time. This reservation, as of July 31, has not been confirmed.

- 3. **Community Education/Court 5** Court 5 is consistently scheduled throughout the week each day during the summer for community education classes. Classes include Jazzercise, gymnastics, tumbling, cheerleading, pickleball, line dancing, kendo and fencing.
- 4. **Community Athletic Groups –** I am working with our user groups on Fall 2023/Winter 2024 practice schedules for youth sports. It is our philosophy to grant user groups the same space that was used during the previous season. Youth practices take place during the months of September through May.
- 5. Facility Usage As our user groups (youth AAU basketball teams) transition back into Homecourt for practices, those groups will practice Monday Thursday 4:30 p.m. 7:30 p.m. We have created more open court space for the general public. Open court times for the general public will be Monday through Thursday 7:30 p.m. 10:00 p.m. and Friday 4:30 p.m. 10:00 p.m. We have made this adjustment to accommodate the need for additional open court space to families in our community.
- 6. **Lease Agreement ReSurge Church –** Our current lease agreement with ReSurge Church is set to expire September 30, 2023. Re-Surge church will not be renewing their contract. The City has allowed for Re-Surge to secure another facility by extending their move out date to February 29, 2024.
- Floor Resurfacing Project This project will be being August 28 and will be completed September 7. The final polyurethane coat will be applied Friday September 1. Due to the smell of the polyurethane, the facility will remain closed until September 11.
- 8. Homecourt Sign We have seen some damage on our Homecourt Sign on the front of our facility. This sign is hanging directly above our front door. We are seeking to install a new panaflex face with new lettering 120" x 120" and convert the light to LED lighting as well. I am seeking to schedule this project during our floor resurfacing project.
- 9. Basketball Backstop Safety Inspection I am seeking to schedule this project August 24 – 27. It is my goal to have this project completed before the floor resurfacing project begins on August 28. I have been in contact with BROC Athletic Product Solutions. This company is based out of Mesa, Arizona. They do have techs currently working in Utah. As of July 31, I am currently working to solidify these dates. This project has never been done. The scope of this project is to ensure all backboards are secured to our ceiling properly and operating in a safe manner.

project at the Meridian transit shelters. We currently have two shelters, one at 3^{rd} and Pine, and one at Ten Mile Crossing.

4. Historic Preservation Projects -

- **Historic Preservation Plan:** SHPO recommends updating Historic Preservation Plans every 10 years, and our current plan is from 2014. We are working on next steps to complete a new plan, which would require grant funding from SHPO to complete. We will also need to release an RFP for a consultant to bid the project.
- **Eggers Farmstead:** HPC has been considering preservation options for the historic Eggers Farmstead. A developer recently purchased the property and will likely tear down the historic structures. They will keep HPC notified, and may work to put historical signage on the site. We are contracting with HullFilm to add the site to the Virtual 360 Tour, and he has completed the photography work.
- **Downtown Historic Reconnaissance Survey:** TAG Historical Research and Consulting has completed fieldwork for a reconnaissance-level survey of approximately 37 city blocks in downtown Meridian. They will complete final details and submit a draft report to HPC and SHPO to review this month.
- **Meridian Speedway Nomination to the Historic Registry:** SHPO has begun work to revise the nomination and is working with their contacts at NPS to resubmit the nomination with the revisions.
