Dear Brian,

Thank you so much for responding to me...I didn't think I would hear from you.

Yes, donuts are spinning and leaving tread marks. I will attach pictures of the intersections and evidence for your information. I will also show you the properties that were damaged, including the one that has never been repaired. I am certain police should have records of the incidents, as I am certain insurance probably required them for the property damage. One house was actually struck and the other house had the car go through the fence and end up in the yard. That incident included damage to an irrigation grate. The other incident happened near the canal bridge and has never been repaired. I don't live directly on Standing Timber, but live in Caven Ridge, which Standing Timber is our transport to our subdivision. The damaged properties have happened in the last couple of years, but the marks on the

road are current. I walk Standing Timber daily so I see the results of these offenses. Three incidents in just a few years' time seems too much for such a small area and that is my concern for needing speed bumps or other deterrence.

Hi Cindy,

I'm familiar with the area as I live out there as well. Can you help me understand what you mean by "donut" offenses? Do you mean vehicles spinning in circles or otherwise leaving tire marks at intersections? If so, do you know which intersections or areas this is occurring, and which properties have been damaged? General times, if known, would also be useful.

Regarding your question, I can include this in the packet information for the next City of Meridian Transportation Commission meeting on July 6 and see if they would like to recommend or request additional review. The Commission is a recommending body to City Council but often asks other departments and agencies to research issues and report back.

A Police Department request would generally be along the lines of "what have you observed" and whether additional enforcement may be warranted. That is often dependent on having more information regarding specific locations and times. An Ada County Highway District (ACHD) request, the transportation authority for non-highways in Meridian, would generally be to evaluate whether traffic calming or other measures may be appropriate. That process can take time and typically involves data collection, evaluation, and neighborhood input.

I'm happy to forward this along with a few more details. You are also welcome to reach out to PD or ACHD directly.

Morning,

I am a resident of Caven Ridge and have a concern about the traffic on Standing Timber road off victory. There is regular offenses of speeding occurring on this road, but also regular “donut” offenses at intersections on the road. There have already been three houses/properties damaged by this hazardous behavior and there are currently and fresh tread marks where these offenses are occurring. I walk the route daily and there have been fresh marks left 3x this week alone. What are the possibilities of speed bumps or other deterrents being added to this road? With the amount of foot traffic and kids on bikes/scooters, I have strong concerns for safety. I know speed bumps were recently added to Cavanaugh subdivision, so you are aware of the hazards in this area. Please consider this area for a project soon, before someone is seriously injured or worse. I know this is a concern for our entire neighborhood and I believe it’s been requested before.
