Hello Lindsey,

Thank you for the interest in these roundabouts. I certainly appreciate when form and function work together. What you're currently seeing at Victory and Amity roundabouts is the Ada County Highway Districts default treatment for landscaping. The intention is purely function, with the berm and large boulders keeping drivers from looking through an intersection and instead focused to the left or right as they enter and exit the intersection.

While the City is not responsible for managing the aesthetics of roundabouts (or roadways), it does often participate. Examples are of the Locust Grove and Victory, Eagle and Zaldia, or Eagle and Amity roundabouts. The process for those due to logistics, were for the City to remove the groundcover sometime after completion and go back in with landscaping that is more aesthetic but still low maintenance. Unfortunately, the Victory and Amity roundabouts on Ten Mile are not currently within City Limits, and so the City prioritizes budget elsewhere. The Legacy Store and Chevron site were developed in the County, and not the City. When these areas are annexed, staff will request that City Council consider additional improvements. Those roundabouts were installed with water so they could be improved in the future.
