The Meridian Parks & Recreation Commission is a volunteer citizens' group that is created and empowered to advise the City on issues relating to park facilities and recreation programs of the City. Their mission is to gather input from staff and other qualified personnel on issues relating to the creation and design of public parks and open spaces; to listen to public input; and to provide advice and recommendations on parks and recreation related matters to the Mayor and City Council.

- 3. Welcome Returning MPR Commissioner Camden Hyde – Steve Siddoway & Jo Greer**
MPR Director Steve Siddoway expressed his excitement to Camden Hyde who was willing to rejoin the MPR Commission as a youth Commissioner for another year. He has been a tremendous asset over the past year. Welcome back!

Commission President Jo Greer thanked Camden for being so involved and for providing good insight on a variety of topics.

- 4. Farewell to MPR Commissioner Jessica West – Jo Greer & Steve Siddoway**
MPR Commission President Jo Greer thanked Commissioner Jessica West for her unprecedented service on the MPR Commission. She expressed Jessica has made a difference in Meridian’s parks, pathways, events, and future amenities. In addition, she thanked Commissioner West for her dedication in assisting the Commission from leading meetings, to leading “Elf on a Shelf”—the movement for the Commission’s Christmas in Meridian float. She brought leadership, ideas, positive energy, and valid concerns in areas requiring attention. Jessica’s sharp attention to detail often helped others to gain a broader perspective of the task at hand. Because of this, Jessica has made all of the Commissioners better while serving on the Commission. While it is sad to see her go and it won’t be the same without her, President Greer wished her the best of luck.

On behalf of the MPR Department, Director Steve Siddoway thanked Jessica for her service to the Commission. She hasn’t hesitated to join in the conversations and speak up, which they really appreciate. If an Elf on a Shelf were present that evening, he would report back to Santa that Jessica has been a good Commissioner!

Commissioner West expressed she really enjoyed being on the Commission, and everyone has been wonderful to work with—very positive and supportive. She stated the Commission has made a lot of huge changes and impacts to the City, along with the MPR Department; overall a team effort. She is grateful for the opportunity to serve.

- 5. Upcoming Events – Shelly Houston**

MPR Marketing Coordinator Shelly Houston provided an Upcoming Events flyer and highlighted the events noted, which is attached to these meeting minutes.

New Business

- 6. MPR Master Plan/Community Center Needs Assessment Kickoff – Art Thatcher**
MPR Director Steve Siddoway introduced Art Thatcher, who is the lead consultant with GreenPlay. GreenPlay was the lead of the consultant team that created the MPR Department’s Parks & Recreation Master Plan in 2015. The Department is contracting with them to update the Master Plan. It has not even been quite six years and Meridian’s population has grown by over 50% since then. It is time to update the Plan. It was a great process when the Department embarked on it six years ago, including public outreach, public involvement, a lot of consensus building, and outreach to the community, focus groups, and stakeholders. There are two key additions to the process: 1) Community Center Feasibility Study that will be part of this master plan update, and 2) Cost Recovery Analysis.

Art Thatcher provided a PowerPoint presentation. Copies of his slides are attached to these meeting minutes.

7. Meridian Homecourt Update – Jake Garro

MPR Homecourt Facility Manager Jake Garro provided an update about the Homecourt via a PowerPoint. Copies of his slides are attached to these meeting minutes.

Commission Feedback:

- **Camden Hyde** – He inquired about the basketball shooting machine that was available 5-6 years ago. *This machine was operational for roughly 1 ½ years but kept breaking down. Parts became harder to find to repair the model. It came to the point where MPR staff had to send the machine to auction and chose not to get a new one, which would cost between \$8,000-\$9,000.*
- **Jo Greer** – She thanked Jake and expressed he really does care about the facility by the way he is maintaining it. She wants to ensure that everyone has equal opportunities to use the space.

8. MPR Facilities Tour Debrief – Steve Siddoway

MPR Director Steve Siddoway reported on September 8, 2021, they held the annual Parks & Recreation Facilities Tour. To accommodate some additional safety protocols, due to Covid-19, MPR staff cancelled the bus and held the whole tour in Kleiner Park. There were a number of stations around the park where MPR staff updated the MPR Commission and Council members who were able to attend on a number of different topics. Steve took this opportunity to allow for any feedback—favorite part, anything they would change for next year, or any lessons learned. The MPR Department does hope to be back on the bus next year.

Commission Feedback:

- **Camden Hyde** – He thought the tour was very well done and beneficial to see the different parts of Kleiner Park specifically. He is looking forward to seeing many more parks next year. He thanked the Department and appreciated their time in taking care of this event for the Commission.
- **Keith Bevan** – He enjoyed the tour and thought it was great. Given the alternative, the Department did a good job. It was nice to see the Community Garden and wished his garden looked like that one!
- **Jennifer Bobo** – Every year she is amazed at the volume of work the MPR Department generates. When she heard all the presentations from everyone, it was amazing how MPR staff does a great job of providing so many different activities and variety of things, between the Community Garden, various tournaments and community events, etc. It was a nice setting to hear it all in such a beautiful park while observing it at the same time. She found the tour really enjoyable.
- **Jo Greer** – She agreed with Commissioners Bobo and Bevan’s comments. Given the situation where MPR staff came up with a really good solution, she enjoyed it. She wasn’t sure how the tour would go. She did not like the alternative more of staying at one park because she likes driving around on the bus to see what’s happening throughout the City. However, participants were able to hear a lot more about what

each division is working on without the bus chatter. Thank you! She also noted the packets that were assembled and handed out to participants were really incredible.

Staff Reports

9. MPR Staff

Parks & Recreation Director Steve Siddoway reported on the following:

- MPR Master Plan Update – The Commissioners heard Art Thatcher’s presentation earlier that evening. Getting to the point to do this presentation has consumed a lot of time over the last several weeks in terms of contracting, figuring the scope and the schedules, having the strategic kickoff last week, etc. There has been a lot of behind-the-scenes work. He looks forward to the ongoing participation of the Council and Commission in the upcoming activities.
- Comprehensive Financial Plan – This is a ten-year plan that is updated every year in the fall by MPR staff, which is a team effort. They just finished updating this plan, which was a significant amount of work. This is a forward look at those projects that they have coming for future parks, staffing needs, etc.
- City-wide Strategic Plan – There has also been an update recently to the City’s Strategic Plan. This is a five-year plan (2021-2025) where they just closed out the last strategic plan in 2020. There are 30+ tactics assigned to the MPR Department. He is looking forward to carrying forward the City’s mission strategically through this planning effort.
- Staff Evaluations – Being at the end of one fiscal year and at the beginning of the next, MPR staff members conduct annual evaluations, which is a big process and time-consuming but important for holding conversations, getting feedback, and setting goals for the next year. They are in the thick of it right now (about halfway through) where everyone is involved.

Parks Superintendent Mike Barton reported on the following:

- Discovery Park Phase 2 – They are opening bids on Discovery Park, Phase 2 on November 3, 2021. MPR staff will see what kind of response they get, do the contracting portion in November/early December, and get people lined up for a spring groundbreaking. This project is on target for near-term construction.

MPR Recreation Manager Garrett White reported on the following:

- Concessions – He has been working with the park concessionaires. There are some RFPs that will go out this winter for Bear Creek, Tully, Discovery, Settlers, and Storey Parks.
- Main Street Market – He is working with the organizers about next year’s market. The last day of the market for this season will be Saturday, October 16, 2021.
- Staff Evaluations – They are conducting all staff evaluations.
- External Events – He is working with outside organizations about 2022 dates and getting them locked in. He is also coordinating with the Clerk’s and Legal offices to potentially update the Temporary Use Permit (TUP) documentation.
- Civic Block – He has tasks regarding the Civic Block project.
- MPR Master Plan Update – He has tasks to work on concerning this project.

- Western Ada Recreation District (WARD) – He has some tasks to complete regarding this.
- Special Events – They are working on Christmas in Meridian and Trunk or Treat.
- Activity Guide – They have been working on the Winter Activity Guide publication and instructor contracts, as well as finding space for classes. If the Civic Block becomes a reality, then the Department will be looking for additional indoor space. If the Commissioners know of any potential locations, please let Garrett know.
- Sports – They have been working on Volleyball and league fees for officials. They are coordinating the Holiday Classic and Cornhole Tournaments. There will be a disc golf tournament on Halloween for youth and adults. They are also advertising for Basketball, Flag Football, and field reservations for 2022.
- Arts & Culture – They have been working on the mural series and are coordinating an unveiling for the art piece at Meridian Cycles. They are working with the Meridian Arts Commission and the Meridian Historic Commission on roles of Commissioners and staff. They are also working on traffic box art wraps and the Initial Point Gallery exhibits.

Pathways Manager Kim Warren reported on the following:

- Pathway Infill Projects – They are moving along with some of the infill projects and are furthest along with the Locust Grove connections across McMillan. Easements were obtained and have been submitted to ACHD. The rest are at approximately 60% and should be wrapped up fairly quickly. For Linder Road, they are going to group those two different connection projects together to bid. These two are close to being done as well, along with the Creason Lateral project.
- Fairview Avenue Roadway Connection – This is another project taking a step closer to being done with some concrete work. They are waiting on the truncated domes for the accessible notifications/crossings.
- Star Road Underpass – The Department received permission from Council to pursue a pedestrian underpass on Star Road. It was decided they would consult for some engineering work outside of a potential cost-share with ACHD just to determine the water level and what to ask for in terms of a structure for a pedestrian underpass. They need to figure out what the task is and what is a more realistic cost for this project, keeping this separate until they decide with Council's help if this is a 'go' or a 'no-go.' If it is a 'go,' they will apply for a cost-share with ACHD as part of this project. Kim has requested initial contract engineering documents.
- Five Mile Pathway Striping – She has received help from Parks crewman Phil Harris who obtained a bid to stripe sections of the Five Mile Pathway. She and Phil will head out to mark these sections in preparation for striping work by the contractor.
- Plan Review – She has ongoing plan review tasks. The City has a new review interface.

Adjourn

Commission President Jo Greer entertained a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Dom Gelsomino moved to adjourn. Commissioner John Nesmith seconded. The vote was unanimous and in favor of the motion.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at approximately 6:56 p.m.
