RE: MOA for Historical Signage along Five Mile Creek Pathway

Staff has been working on a partnership between Brighton Development, Inc. and the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO) to mitigate the adverse effects of construction along the Five Mile Creek and Creason Lateral. Brighton proposed to work with staff and SHPO to develop, fund, and install two educational signs along the Five Mile Creek Pathway. We see this as an opportunity to help educate our pathway users about the history of our surface irrigation. One sign will be placed at the new trailhead on Ten Mile Road, and the other will be placed where the Five Mile Creek Pathway intersects with Black Cat Road. In exchange for the donated signs, the City would own and maintain these signs. The signs would be made from high pressure laminate that has a 10-year warranty mounted on steel posts.
