Whereas, 2025 marks the 19th Annual World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. Its recognition will promote a better understanding of abuse, neglect and exploitation of older adults; and,

Whereas, organizations like the Ada County Victim Services Center recognize the importance of taking action to raise awareness of abuse, neglect and exploration of older adults.
