Lung Cancer Awareness Month November 2024

WHEREAS: According to the American Cancer Society, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related death among individuals in the United States, accounting for more deaths than colon cancer,

breast cancer, and prostate cancer combined; and

WHEREAS: In 2023, an estimated 238,340 individuals in the United States were diagnosed with lung cancer,

and 127,070 individuals (approximately 350 individuals per day) will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS: In 2023, approximately 103,000 of the 127,070 lung cancer deaths (81 percent) were caused by

cigarette smoking directly, with an additional 3,560 lung cancer deaths caused by second-hand

smoke; and

WHEREAS: Quitting smoking remains the single most effective way to avoid lung cancer. The Middletown

Township Health Department will be proudly participating in the Great American Smokeout, which is the American Cancer Society's public education campaign that is observed on the third

Thursday of every November to help people quit smoking; and

WHEREAS: On Thursday, November 21st, the Middletown Township Health Department will have a table at

the entrance of Town Hall where they will be distributing free Quit Kits. Community members are

encouraged to stop by to pick one up and learn how they can lead smoke-free lives; and

WHEREAS: During Lung Cancer Awareness Month, we honor all those living with lung cancer and their loved
