Their deaths have left indelible holes in the fabric of our tight-knit community; and WHEREAS: In the aftermath of these horrific attacks, thousands of Americans displayed the highest levels of bravery and selflessness, risking or sacrificing their own lives to save their fellow citizens; and WHEREAS: We pay homage to the emergency responders and ordinary citizens who performed extraordinary acts of courage and valor during our nation's direst moment of need; and WHEREAS: The tragic events of September 11, 2001 have unified our nation against the forces of hatred and oppression and reaffirmed our dedication to the fundamental American ideals of freedom and liberty; and WHEREAS: A remembrance ceremony will be held at the Middletown World Trade Center Memorial Gardens on Sunday, September 11, 2022 at 7:15 p.m. As we gather at the Gardens, we are once again demonstrating the resiliency, determination, compassion, strength, and patriotism that define us as Americans. - **THEREFORE:** I, Mayor Tony Perry and the Middletown Township Committee, do hereby proclaim September 11, 2022 as **Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance** in the Township of Middletown.
