# ANNOUNCEMENTS & FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

City Manager Steve McHarris stated he had no announcements.

Councilmember Phan made a request to agendize the following:

- An amendment to the existing ordinance for third-party food delivery vendor services to prohibit regulatory response fees. Mayor Tran supported the request.
- 2. A discussion to explore opportunity housing and prohibit single-family zoning. Stating that it can provide an opportunity to explore a diverse stock of housing and expand on the existing Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) ordinance.

Councilmember Dominguez spoke about Laura's Law, stating that the County would be voting on it the following day and requested that the City Manager send a document

noting the City of Milpitas's endorsement. Mayor Tran stated that no new document would need to be prepared and that the City Manager should just share the document previously approved by Council.

Councilmember Chua provided an update to residents asking about Below Market Rate (BMR) homes and renting out rooms. She stated that City Attorney Diaz informed her that it was not allowed, and he would prepare a memo in regards to this matter.

Vice Mayor Montano announced that Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) buses will no longer board passengers in the front of the bus. As a result of COVID19, all passengers will be required to board from the back of the bus to help protect the bus drivers. She also noted that bus fares will be free.

Councilmember Dominguez made a request to agendize a discussion on the distribution of vaccines, looking at equity and ethnicity. She requested that the Council consider drafting a letter to the County expressing support and requesting attention to the areas that have been heavily impacted. She requested the discussion be scheduled for the next Council meeting. Mayor Tran supported the request.

<u>Motion:</u> to amend the item to implement a pilot program for 30 days with a seven-day hotel voucher from the lowest responsible bidder in Milpitas, for senior citizens ages 55 and older, disabled individuals with the proper medical record, and school district

students and their families for an amount not to exceed \$25,000. Mayor Tran stated that he would give his travel budget of \$5,000 and his budget for an intern to fund this program. Councilmember Chua stated that she would do the same.
