





ARTIST STATEMENT

"Art is in my blood. I'm driven. Physically I need to paint. My process begins with a certain motion, a feeling, an energy. Technique and textures are woven into compositions creating a sense of depth, which begins to tell my story. My works can evolve themselves; one layer inspires the next, and the next may seem to bear no relation to what came before. My intention is to capture the harmony between beautiful and chaotic; a construction and deconstruction of space to evoke the emotional connections between us, nature and our modern world. Everyday is an opportunity for us to become more aware, to be inspired, to share a willingness to interact, while being submerged into both the light and dark influences of this wonderfully profound existence that we call life. Most importantly it's a life in which I love living, creating and sharing with others."

I'm a local Bay Area artist with a passion to beautify, support local business, and provide welcoming and safe spaces for the people who live and visit here.

The Milpitas Montague Pedestrian Overcrossing Project is an asset to city, business owners and a convenience to patrons. I'm proposing to paint an abstract based mural expanding approximately 1200+ square foot length of the provided site specific spaces. The designs will be both elevated and sophisticated which will breathe life, energy, and momentum into the space through the use of abstract forms and imagery. Inspirations from the historic roots of Milpitas will blend into the modern high tech world and architecture with colorful gradients that will complement the exterior of the overdressing structure and surrounding buildings. The use of abstract forms mixed with subtle hints of imagery will allow for a very broad demographic of people (including ages of youth to seniors) to experience the space at their own pace. This will also help create a dialog while telling a story in which people will be able interact and engage through their own perspective so that each viewer will connect with the piece on a personal level. Abstract form help to work their imaginations and mind, making people think "outside the box"; for a moment taking them out of their everyday lives to appreciate something maybe not so literal. Additionally, influences of nature and other native elements will be incorporated into the design as the mural develops.

The benefit of creating murals is multifold. It weaves culture and history through local spaces for all to enjoy, it creates a welcoming atmosphere for residents and visitors.

Furthermore well respected and designed murals have proven to greatly deter unceasing, unsightly marks of inappropriate street vandalism as taggers are less likely to paint on a mural created by a local, respected artist than they are to claim a blank, unowned wall, prime for the taking.

I have years of experience working for private, corporate, and city funded art projects and I am very familiar with similar scopes of work, procedures and requirements. I know what is expected from me as Artist and as well as professional and have what is take to completion such projects as this. I would be an honor to collaborate with the City of Milpitas for this project.












MONTAGUE PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING - NORTH ELEVATION

These additional spaces are currently bare concrete.







MONTAGUE PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING - NORTH ELEVATION - EXPLAINED



Native Roots + Historical Tribute + Cultural Symbolism

The abstract designs and symbols are intended to reflect the historic roots and natives to the areas, the Muwekma Ohlone people who were the original residents of the Bay Area.

The four columns contain layers and layers of under-paintings and designs inspired from different languages, traditional patterns found in woven coil baskets and feather patterns.

The dark and light contrasting colors throughout the design mimic and carry suggestions of body paint used during ceremonies and furthermore the flow and movements of this design suggest and remind us of the cultural traditions of Dance and Rhythm.

The centralized support (one on each side of the Overcrossing) as imagery of an Eagle "a totem-like" tribute with it wings out which represents storytelling and the passing down of information from generation to generation.

Hidden throughout the artwork are silhouette of native landscape, hills, mountains, huts, people, and activities like hunting, fishing.







Zig Zag Patterns of basket weaving + techniques used by the Ohlone Tribes










EAST ELEVATION



EAST ELEVATIONS - EXPLAINED

Diversity + Movement + Motion

An abstract vortex-like roundabout represents movement and Transportation.

These elements represents the mixing of our diverse community; each specific color, line and shape representing the uniqueness of people and individuals. The colors are squeezed together in the center (transportation hub, ie bart station) then they all go off to their different destinations.

The composition of all these movements (destinations) and the diversity of these colors and lines (people) all mixing together in one space creates a whole, a unit (representing our community) = Colorfully Beautiful and Diverse!

East location - In some cultures the East can also represents growth.

This location and direction as an intention for people to keep an open mind and continue to better themselves so they can reach their highest potentials in life.


The alternating colors and lines have dual meanings which are complementary to the existing Overcrossing artwork also mimicking the architecture and color palette, pulling the color from the overdressing to the ground












MONTAGUE PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING - Street View - Theme and motion continues to wrap the surfaces












MONTAGUE PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING - SOUTH ELEVATION - STREET VIEW









MONTAGUE PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING - SOUTH ELEVATION - STREET VIEW

Continuing to play on all the elements of above, this view ties the piece together in 360 degrees, but with more of an emphasis of Nature and blooming into the surrounding landscape.













MONTAGUE PEDESTRIAN OVERCROSSING - WEST ELEVATION - STREET VIEW


