RECOMMENDED ACTION:	Approve and adopt a proclamation honoring Bob Buscemi for his years of dedicated service and lasting contributions to the City of Milton, recognizing his retirement and the positive impact of his work on the community.	


BACKGROUND:

Bob Buscemi has made a lasting and positive impact on Milton in countless ways. As the City's longtime City Architect and, later as Community Development Director and Special Projects Director, he played a key role in nearly every major construction project in Milton's history.

His contribution includes overseeing the design and construction of City Hall, Fire Station 42, Milton City Park and Preserve's Community Center, and the Public Safety Complex (which houses Fire Station 44, Milton Police headquarters, and the Milton Municipal Court). He was also instrumental in shaping the development of downtown Crabapple, advancing Destination Deerfield initiative, and guiding numerous private projects to ensure they aligned with Milton's high standards for quality, character, and design. After many years of dedicated service, Buscemi is retiring at the end of May, leaving behind a legacy that will continue to shape the Milton community for generations to come.
