On August 23, 2023, the Planning and Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing to consider the rezoning request. The subject site was located 790' North of E. Business 83 along the East side of N. Stewart Road. There was public opposition during the P&Z Meeting. The concern voiced were in regards to higher tax rates. The board unanimously recommended approval.

Emigdio Villanueva, RGV Villa Development, LLC, has an office here in Mission, and they are excited for this project and to be able use the land to build townhomes. This development would be beneficial to the city. The engineer for this project also provided a brief description of the project and how it would bring a new, residential community to Mission. The proposed project layout was presented to council as well.

Mayor Pro Tem Plata had a concern with the location for this request. There had been a lot of investment in this area recently, and he was concerned that a portable building would affect the beautification of the area.

Eliel Gonzalez, the applicant, was called up and explained that this is the second time they were applying for this permit. He stated that if the CUP was approved, he would then be cleaning up the lot, and since it was going to be a nursery, the area would be green.

22. Authorization to accept the FY 2023-2024 Other Victim Assistance Grant (OVAG) from the Office of the Attorney Generals' Crime Victim Services Division – Torres

The grant was a one-year grant for FY 2023-2024. The total amount of the grant award was \$49,500.00. This grant would allow the Mission Police Department to continue the services provided by our Crime Victims Liaison program. There was no cash match required by the City of Mission. This grant would be in effect from September 2023 through August 2024.

23. Authorization to re-enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between Tropical Texas Behavioral Health and the City of Mission Police Department – Torres

The Mission Police Department was requesting authorization to re-enter into a memorandum of understanding with Tropical Texas Behavioral Health, for the purpose of providing our community with resources for mental health and/or substance use disorders. This agreement included assigning a Mental Health Unit Clinician to our police department, to assist & support our mental health unit police officers during calls for service in our community. This agreement would be in effect from September 2023 to August 2024.

24. Authorization to accept the 2024 STEP Comprehensive Grant from the Texas Department of Transportation – Torres

The Mission Police Department was requesting authorization to accept the 2024 Comprehensive Selective Traffic Enforcement Program Grant from the Texas Department of Transportation. The grant award amount was \$37,000.00 and would be utilized for traffic enforcement purposes. There was an in-kind match of \$9,417.02 required by the City of Mission.

28. Authorization to extend First One-Year renewal option for Sealcoat Pavement Services for Public Works Department – Terrazas

Staff was seeking authorization to extend the First One-Year Renewal Option for Sealcoat Pavement Services with Valley Striping Corp. effective September 21st, 2023. Prices would remain the same in the amount of \$0.139 per square foot. Orders would be placed on an as needed basis throughout the one-year base term.

29. Authorization to extend First One-Year renewal option for Striping, Pavement Marking Services for Public Works Department – Terrazas

Staff was seeking authorization to extend the First One-Year Renewal Option for Striping, Pavement Marking Services with Valley Striping Corp. effective September 21st, 2023. Prices would remain the same. Orders would be placed on an as needed basis throughout the one-year base term.

30. Amendment to Memorandum of Understanding between Mission CISD and Boys & Girls Club of Mission to include meal program – Venecia

Mission CISD entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with the Boys and Girls Club of Mission to provide transportation services from select campuses to the Boys and Girls Club facility on August 28, 2023. The amendment to the Agreement will allow meal services under the Texas Department of Agriculture sponsored Child and Adult Care At-Risk Supper meals. This partnership would positively impact the students to allow the participation in the district's Child Nutrition Supper program, ensuring students receive the nutrition they need.

31. Authorization to enter into a Personal Services Contract under Tex. Local Gov't Code 252.022(a)(4) with De Saro Public Relations Firm for services related to the City of Mission State of The City Address – Geddes

De Saro Public Relations Firm would provide event coordination, event design, management services, sponsorship sales, and visual content for the 2023 Mayor's State Of The City Address.
