

ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL IN ITS ENTIRETY ORDINANCE NO. 5223 AND REPLACE IT WITH THIS ORDINANCE REVISING THE PREVIOUSLY APPROVED CIVIL SERVICE CLASSIFICATIONS (MISSION FIRE DEPARTMENT) FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE 2022-2023 FISCAL YEAR; SPECIFICALLY, REMOVE THE ASST CHIEF POSITION (1 POSITION) AND ADD ANOTHER POSITION UNDER DEPUTY CHIEF CLASSIFICATION (INCREASING THE NUMBER OF DEPUTY CHIEFS TO 5 POSITIONS).

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2022, the City Council considered, passed, and approved Ordinance No. 5223 ordering the classification of certain positions of the Mission Fire Department, effective October 1, 2022, made subject to amendment or repeal in accordance with the fiscal year for the City of Mission which expires on September 30, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City of Mission to remove the Asst Chief classification (1 position) and add another position under Deputy Chief classification (increasing the number of Deputy Chiefs to 5 positions); and

WHEREAS, the City Council intends to retain the same number of positions for 2022-2023 for all other classifications.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MISSION, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. As of the effective date of this ordinance, the classified positions for the Mission Fire Department as previously approved by City Council under Ordinance No. 5223, see Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, shall be repealed in its entirety and replaced with this Ordinance, including Exhibit B, the revised Civil Service Classifications (Mission Fire Department) for the remainder of the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon City Council's approval and subject to amendment or repeal in accordance with the fiscal year for the City of Mission which shall expire on September 30, 2023.

Section 3. The City Secretary of the City of Mission is hereby authorized and directed to publish such ordinance in a newspaper having circulation in Mission, Hidalgo County, Texas.

Section 4. If any part or parts of this ordinance are found to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court having competent jurisdiction, then such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining parts hereof and such remaining parts shall remain in full force and effect, and to that extent this ordinance is considered severable.

CONSIDERED, PASSED, AND APPROVED this 13th day of February, 2023, at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Mission, Texas, at which a quorum was present and which was held in accordance with Chapter 551, Texas Government Code.
