And call upon all citizens of Mission and upon all patriotic, civic and educational organizations to observe the week of May 15 through 21, 2022, as Police Week with appropriate ceremonies in which all of our people may join in commemorating police officers, past and present, who by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities have rendered a dedicated service to their communities and in doing so, have established for themselves an enviable and enduring reputation for preserving the rights and security of all citizens.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** we the City Council of the City of Mission call upon all citizens of Mission, Texas to observe Monday, May 16, 2022 as Peace Officers Memorial Day in Mission, Texas to honor those peace officers who, through their courageous deeds, have lost their lives or have become disabled in the performance of duty.
