



WHEREAS, one person dies every 33 seconds from heart disease, making it the leading cause of death and disability for men and women in the United States, according to the American Heart Association; and

WHEREAS, someone has a heart attack every 40 seconds in the U.S., with about 1 in 5 heart attacks silent, meaning the damage is done, but he person is not aware of it; and

WHEREAS, the American Heart Association estimates that more than 6 in 10 U.S. adults (61%) will have some type of cardiovascular disease, or CVD, by 2050; and

WHEREAS, more than half of people in the U.S. (51%) do not know that heart disease is the leading cause of death in the country, according to a recent Harris Poll survey conducted on behalf of the American Heart Association; and

WHEREAS, South Texas Health System Heart – one of the first freestanding cardiology and cardiovascular hospitals built in the U.S. – has provided comprehensive quality, compassionate inpatient and outpatient cardiovascular care for the South Texas region for nearly 30 years; and
