**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MISSION SPRINGS WATER DISTRICT
ADOPTING THE 2025 COACHELLA VALLEY REGIONAL URBAN WATER MANAGEMENT
PLAN AND THE 2025 MISSION SPRING WATER DISTRICT WATER SHORTAGE
CONTINGENCY PLAN**

WHEREAS, the Urban Water Management Planning Act requires urban water suppliers providing water for municipal purposes to more than 3,000 customers or supplying more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually to prepare and adopt, in accordance with prescribed requirements, an urban water management plan every five years; and

WHEREAS, the Urban Water Management Planning Act specifies the requirements and procedures for adopting such urban water management plans, including regional urban water management plans; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Coachella Valley Regional Urban Water Management Plan ("2025 RUWMP") has been prepared at the direction of participating agencies, including Coachella Valley Water District, Coachella Water Authority, Desert Water Agency, City of Indio, Mission Creek Water District, and Myoma Dunes Mutual Water Company, in accordance with the Urban Water Management Planning Act and other applicable provisions of law; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Water Shortage Contingency Plan ("2025 WSCP") has been prepared for Mission Spring Water District in accordance with Water Code section 10632 and related statutory requirements; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable law, including Water Code section 10642 and Government Code section 6066, a Notice of Public Hearing regarding the 2025 RUWMP and the 2025 WSCP was published within the jurisdiction of Mission Spring Water District on May 19, 2026 and May 24, 2026; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with applicable law, including but not limited to Water Code section 10642, a public hearing was held on June 3, 2026 at 9:00 AM, or soon thereafter, at 66575 2nd Street, Desert Hot Springs, 92240, in order to provide members of the public and other interested entities with the opportunity to be heard in connection with the proposed adoption of the 2025 RUWMP and the 2025 WSCP and issues related thereto; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said public hearing, Mission Spring Water District, among other things, encouraged the active involvement of diverse social, cultural, and economic members of the community within its service area with regard to the 2025 RUWMP and the 2025 WSCP, and encouraged community input regarding both plans; and

WHEREAS, Section 10652 of the California Water Code provides that the California Environmental Quality Act (Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) of the Public Resources Code) ("CEQA") does not apply to the preparation and adoption of an urban water management plan and related water shortage contingency planning documents; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of Mission Springs Water District wishes to adopt the 2025 RUWMP and the 2025 WSCP and has determined said plans to be consistent with

applicable law and to be accurate representations of the water resources planning and shortage response planning for Mission Springs Water District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of Mission Springs Water District hereby resolves as follows:

1. All of the above recitals are true;
2. The Board of Directors of Mission Springs Water District adopts the 2025 RUWMP, as amended by changes incorporated by the Board of Director as a result of input received (if any) at the public hearing;
3. The Board of Directors of Mission Springs Water District adopts the 2025 WSCP, as amended by changes incorporated by the Mission Springs Water District as a result of input received (if any) at the public hearing;
4. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to submit copies of the 2025 RUWMP and the 2025 WSCP as required by applicable law and to make said plans available to the public no later than thirty (30) days after filing with the Department of Water Resources;
5. The Board of Directors finds and determines that this Resolution is not subject to CEQA pursuant to Water Code Section 10652; and
6. The documents and materials that constitute the record of proceedings on which this Resolution and the above findings have been based are located at 66575 2nd Street, Desert Hot Springs, 92240. The custodian for these records is the Executive Assistant.
