In Accordance with LGC § 102.007(c), adoption of a budget that will require raising more revenue from property taxes than in the previous year from property taxes than in the previous year requires a separate vote of the governing body to ratify the the property tax increase reflected in the budget. A vote under this subsection is in addition to and separate from the vote to adopt the budget or a vote to set the tax rate required by Chapter 26, Tax Code or other law.
