RECOMMENDED ACTION: Approve the Alternative Procurement Process for Electric Line of

Business for Electric Inventory Material from May 15, 2022, through

July 15, 2022

BACKGROUND

Section 252.022(c) of the Texas Local Government Code provides that a municipally owned electric utility may define by resolution an alternative procurement procedure for the purchase of goods and services related to the electric utility. On June 28, 2018, the Board of Trustees approved the NBU Purchasing Policy by resolution, which defined a procedure for procurement of goods and services for NBU's electric line of business. The Purchasing Policy was later revised and approved on October 31, 2019. FINAAmong other conditions, the Purchasing Policy requires NBU staff to notify the Board of Trustees of any procurement over \$250,000 that uses the electric line of business procurement procedure.

Listed below are the procurements in excess of \$250,000 submitted to the Purchasing Manager for the period of May 15, 2022, through July 15, 2022, using the electric line of business procurement process.
