1. Vegetation Fire Jack Smith Park – Regional Response and Containment On Saturday, July 26, 2025, at approximately 7:26 p.m., a vegetation fire broke out near Jack Smith Memorial Park. The incident prompted a rapid and coordinated response from City staff, San Bernardino County Fire, San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department, BNSF, and the Mohave Valley Fire Department. Thanks to this strong multi-agency effort, the fire was fully contained with no reported injuries or structural damage. This incident underscores the importance of regional collaboration, particularly with the Mohave Valley Fire Department, whose timely support was critical in helping contain the fire. The fire originated near a homeless encampment along the river's edge. A suspect, Shawn Brown, was located and arrested by deputies early the following morning. He remains in custody at the Colorado River Station, with bail set at \$30,000. See attached press release and event photos for additional details.

### 4. Citywide Maintenance and Beautification Efforts Continue

The City of Needles remains focused on infrastructure, safety, and community pride through ongoing, visible improvements. Ahead of the new school year starting August 13, Public Works crews repainted crosswalks near school zones to ensure clear, high-visibility paths for students and families. Crews also trimmed trees encroaching on power lines at the Golf Course Maintenance Yard as part of fire abatement efforts, reducing hazards and protecting utility infrastructure. Pothole repair remains a top priority. The City continues to respond to road surface issues across neighborhoods, with a recent repair completed on D Street as part of these ongoing efforts to improve drivability and extend roadway life. Special thanks to Frontier Communications for clearing overgrown vegetation at their Front Street property and to the property owner on D Street for removing abandoned vehicles and cleaning up their parcel. These improvements enhance neighborhood safety, appearance, and quality of life. This work reflects the City Council's commitment to maintaining clean, safe, and resilient community spaces through active partnership and stewardship. Photos from this week's efforts are attached.

### 5. Mayor Jernigan Showcases Needles on KNTR's "Speak Out"

On May 30, 2025, Mayor Janet Jernigan appeared on KNTR's *Speak Out* radio show alongside Hanna Guy, Senior Director of Brand and Marketing for Peanuts Worldwide, to spotlight an exciting partnership between Peanuts Worldwide, the City of Needles, and local nonprofit Foundation for Hospital Art. The collaboration includes a community PaintFest on August 12 at the Colorado River Medical Center, where residents will help create two large-scale murals. One features the classic Peanuts gang, and the other highlights Spike—Snoopy's desert-dwelling brother inspired by Charles Schulz's time living in Needles. During the segment, Mayor Jernigan also highlighted the City's broader tourism and community engagement efforts, including preparations for the Route 66 Centennial in 2026, the continued success of the City's award-winning parks system, and Needles High School's impressive 41 state championships. ### 6. Aquatic Center Wrap-Up & Extended Morning Programs

The Needles Aquatic Center concluded its regular summer operations on August 1, 2025, after another successful season serving local families through swim lessons, open swim, youth camps, and private rentals. While the main pool season has ended, Morning Lap Swim and Exercise programs remain active through the first week of September, continuing to offer accessible, low-cost wellness opportunities for the community. Lap Swim is available Monday through Thursday from 6:30–8:00 AM, followed by Morning Exercise from 8:00–

9:15 AM. These early morning sessions remain popular with residents and reflect the City's ongoing commitment to public health and active living. Staff will now begin seasonal maintenance and prepare for next year's aquatic programming.

7. 2025 Summer Youth Programs Conclude with Strong Community Support
The City of Needles successfully wrapped up its 2025 summer youth programs
this week, providing community-supported activities for local families. The
Summer Day Camp Program was offered at no cost thanks to generous support
from The Legacy Foundation and River Daze with more than 150 participants.
Alongside basketball and swim programs, these efforts provided safe, structured
environments for local youth throughout the summer. Special thanks go to all
the volunteer coaches who generously donated their time and energy to support
the Jr. and Pee Wee Basketball Program. Their involvement was critical to the
program's success and community impact. These programs reflect the City
Council's continued commitment to accessible, family-friendly services. Staff will
now shift focus to upcoming fall and winter programming with taking signups

### 8. Needles Showcased at Ontario International Airport

The City of Needles is now featured at Ontario International Airport (ONT) as part of the new "Discover Inland Empire" campaign—a regional initiative launched to promote Southern California's most dynamic destinations. Spearheaded by Visit Inland Empire in partnership with ONT, the campaign introduces millions of travelers to the diverse attractions across the region, with Needles proudly highlighted among them. Digital displays inside the terminal showcase Needles' iconic imagery, including historic railcars and desert landscapes, helping position the city as a unique destination within the broader Inland Empire. This effort aligns with City Council's strategic priorities to promote tourism, expand regional visibility, and attract economic activity. This exposure not only elevates Needles' profile at one of the nation's fastest-growing airports, but also reinforces our standing as a welcoming and adventure-ready stop in Southern California. 9. Jack Smith Park Lift Station – Pump Replacement Complete
The Wastewater Department, in coordination with EUSI, LLC, the City's
contracted provider for operational support services at the wastewater treatment
facility, successfully completed repairs to the Jack Smith Park lift station this
week. In May, both pumps at the site failed, requiring the procurement of two
new Pentair Hydromatic grinder pumps. This week, crews pumped out the wet
well and installed and tested both pumps. The lift station is now back to full
operation. Staff logged motor hours, recorded amp readings, and documented
the installation with photos of the equipment nameplates. This efficient and wellexecuted repair effort restored critical wastewater infrastructure serving the Jack
Smith area. Refer to the attached images for a look at the repair.

### 10. Fall Spay & Neuter Clinic Scheduled for September 25–26

The Needles Animal Shelter will host its Fall Spay and Neuter Clinic on September 25th and 26th in partnership with Dr. Angelina Beeks of Angels Touch Mobile Vet. The event is by appointment only, and a non-refundable deposit is required. All are welcome to participate. To reserve a spot, residents must fill out an application and pay the deposit in person at the Needles Animal Shelter, located at 1662 Flip Mendez Parkway. This bi-annual clinic is in high demand and typically fills quickly, so early registration is encouraged. For more information or to schedule an appointment, residents can call the shelter at (760) 326-4952. This program continues to support public health, responsible pet ownership, and the City's broader animal welfare goals. Refer to the attached fly for more information.

11. Youth Golf Camp Concludes with Community Support and Lasting Impact
The 2025 Summer Youth Golf Camp at Rivers Edge Golf Course officially
wrapped up this week, closing out a season of instruction, growth, and positive
youth engagement. Operated in partnership with Touchstone Golf, the camp
welcomed dozens of local youth and emphasized discipline, sportsmanship, and
teamwork. A highlight of the final week was the annual Putting Contest hosted
by the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Colorado River Station, which included a
generous \$880 donation from their nonprofit River Daze to support this year's
program. We extend our sincere thanks to the Sheriff's Department for their
continued presence and commitment to Needles youth—your support helped

### 12. Route 66 Channel 2 Now Live

As a quick update to the item from the manager's report two weeks ago — Channel 2 on Route 66 Broadband is now live. Community programming has officially launched and includes event calendars, City Council meeting replays, public notices, and community flyers on a continuous loop. This tool directly supports Council's public engagement goals by making timely City information more visible and accessible to residents. Appreciation again to Route 66 Broadband for helping make this happen.

### 13. Summer Reading Program Wraps Up with Family Entertainment

The Needles Branch Library successfully concluded its 2025 Summer Reading Program, *Tales of Enchantment*, which promoted literacy and lifelong reading through interactive, educational activities for all ages. Throughout the summer, the library hosted a series of live performances, culminating this past Tuesday, July 29, 2025, with a featured appearance by Comic Master Ventriloquist Joe Gandelman. His high-energy, family-friendly show was a fitting end to a season of storytelling, imagination, and learning. These events directly support the City Council's goals to foster youth engagement, literacy, and community enrichment. ### Suspect Responsible for Brush Fire near Jack Smith Memorial Park Identified and Arrested

DATE/TIME: July 26, 2025, at approximately 7:26 p.m.

INCIDENT: PC 452(C) - Unlawfully Causing a Fire - Wreckless Burning

LOCATION: Jack Smith Memorial Park, Needles, CA

SUSPECT(S): Shawn Brown, 38-Years-Old, Transient of Needles, CA

VICTIM(S): State of California

SUMMARY: On Saturday, July 26, 2025, at approximately 7:26 p.m., deputies with the Colorado River Station / Needles Police department responded to a report of a large brush fire near Jack Smith Memorial Park in the City of Needles. Through investigation, it was determined the fire was started near a homeless encampment located within the dense brush near the river's edge.

On Sunday, July 27, 2025, at approximately 3:44 a.m., deputies located the suspect, identified as Shawn Brown, in the area. Brown was detained and interviewed at the Colorado River Station. During the investigation, Brown was found to be the person who unlawfully started the fire. Brown was subsequently arrested on the above mentioned charges and was transported to the Colorado River Station jail for booking. Brown remains in the custody of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department with a bail amount of \$30,000.00, awaiting a court hearing.


