SUBJECT: WEEKLY MEMORANDUM

DATE: May 17, 2024

- 1. The San Bernardino County Fire Protection District (SBCFPD) remains dedicated to providing secure and efficient hazardous waste management services for the residents of Needles, aiming to safeguard public health and the environment. City staff is pleased to announce that the SBCFPD successfully conducted a Household Hazardous Waste Collection event last March. The event engaged 36 participants and collected 2,035 pounds of household hazardous waste and e-waste. Please refer to the attached report for more details.
- 2. City officials and staff met with King of the Hammers Off-Highway Motor Vehicle race organizers on Monday, May 13, 2024. The King of Hammers event in Johnson Valley draws over 530 teams and garners the attendance of over 80,000 fans in person, with an additional 2 million viewers tuning in online. The organizers are currently exploring opportunities to expand a similar chance in Needles. 2022 AB-2152 was enacted by the California legislature, updating the California Vehicle Code to launch a pilot program in Needles, slated to run until January 1, 2028. The initiative is designed to integrate off-highway motor vehicles (OHMV) into the city's transportation framework by permitting use on specific road segments in and surrounding Needles.
- 3. The new Needles Area Transit (NAT) website launched on Monday, May 13, 2024. The updated site provides riders with the latest route information, a "Plan Your Trip on NAT" tool, and details on various programs such as Medical Transportation, Shopper Shuttle, Dial-A-Ride, and NAT Deviated Fixed Route. - 4. On May 15, 2024, the annual Run for the Wall procession honoring Vietnam Veterans made its yearly stop in Needles. Over 300 motorcyclists gathered at El Garces in Downtown Needles, where they were warmly welcomed by community members, city officials, city staff, the Needles Chamber of Commerce, Needles Tourism, the Needles High School Band, the Fort Mojave Tribal Band, Teamsters Local 1932, the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Honor Guard, the San Bernardino

County Sheriff's Department, Set Free Church, and the California Highway Patrol. The Needles Military Moms provided lunch, while the Daughters of the American Revolution served ice cream to the participants.

- 5. On May 18, 2024, the City of Needles Animal Shelter staff held a vaccination and licensing clinic for dogs and cats. Pets received various vaccinations, including rabies, Bordetella, microchips, and rattlesnake shots. The clinic issued 99 city dog licenses, administered 240 vaccinations, and implanted 13 microchips. According to Needles City ordinances, dogs over six months of age must have a city license and valid rabies vaccination. These clinics help dog owners comply with these requirements by offering special rates on dog licenses. Held bi-annually, these events have proven successful in promoting compliance. Please refer to the attached photos for a look into the clinic.
- 6. This upcoming **Friday** has been declared "Decoration Day" at the Needles Riverview Cemetery. This year is the 13th Annual Decoration Day, which will be held on May 24. It will be an opportunity for the community to come out to tend to the gravesites of family members and friends. In addition, Veterans' gravesites will be decorated with the traditional white cross and American flag to honor them for their service to our country.

If you're interested in participating in the 13th Annual Decoration Day, we welcome you to the Needles Riverview Cemetery at 7:00 a.m. on **Friday, May 2024**. Please bring your hand-tools such as a shovel, clippers, and gas-powered weed eaters, as well as garbage bags and water for hydration. Garbage receptacles will be available on-site for disposal of trash.

A Memorial Day service will be held at the cemetery on **Monday**, **May 27**, **at 11:00** a.m. We kindly ask for your help decorating and removing flags and crosses from the grounds. Your participation is crucial in making this event a success. And remember to join us for the service at 11:00 a.m. on Monday!

The Needles Riverview Cemetery welcomes all tax-exempt donations to help support either the Riverview or Old Pioneer Cemeteries. Donations are being sought to replace the American flags that previously lined the cemetery roads. - 7. Congratulations to the Needles High School Golf Team for placing third in the 2024 Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association (NIAA) Class 2A State Golf Championship last Wednesday. The tournament was held at the Ruby View Golf Course in Elko, Nevada.
- 8. Congratulations to the Needles High School boys' baseball and girls' softball teams for their impressive victories in securing the NIAA 2A State Championships on Saturday. A triumphant victory parade welcomed the State Champions back home after their success. Additionally, the girls' softball team received the state academic title with All-State honors. This marks four state titles this year and the 29th NIAA

State Title overall for Needles High School. Attached are photos capturing the highlights of this remarkable achievement and celebration.
