Old Section of Colorow Trail Work Day

May 30, 2025 from 9am to 1pm

Overview

Roaring Fork Outdoor Volunteers received approval from the BLM to perform work on the Old Section of Colorow Trail. CEC reached out to the town of New Castle to loop them in on the plan.

This section of trail had no drains and all the precipitation ran directly down the trail, which over time washed out the middle of the trail. The washed-out sections of trail became deeper than the surrounding trail and held snow and ice during the winter causing hikers to walk around these sections, widening the trail. In order to create a sustainable trail volunteers narrowed sections of the trail in order to protect the surrounding vegetation, built a rock drain above a severely run out section of trail, built several dirt drains, and removed loose rock from the trails.

RFOV understood and supported the importance of including litter pick up. Prior to trail work volunteers walked around Alder Park to pick up litter. There were lots of small pieces of food wrappers and single-use plastic.
