

Completion Timeline

Each person has four years to complete the course requirements for either the Road Scholar or Road Master Program. Certain courses expire before the four year deadline:

- Flagging (Three Years)
- First Aid (Two Years)
- CPR (Two Years)

All courses must be current upon completion of the Road Scholar or Road Master Program.

Students may take courses for the Road Scholar or Road Master Program at the same time. So long as courses remain current, students can attain both Road Scholar and Road Master certification at the same time.

Online Courses

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Frequently Asked Questions

1. Are workshops or outside classes accepted for credit?

Yes. To receive credit for both the First Aid and CPR Courses taken from other agencies, email copies of the front and back of each card to IdahoT2@LHTAC.org. Other courses or workshops directly related to your job may qualify. Send an email to the above address with any certificates, agendas, or course material and request a review.

2. Is there an obligation to complete the program?

No. Take the knowledge and skills you learned and move on.

3. What are the fees for courses?
