**Billing:**

**Customer Service:**

- There were many dog complaints during the month of April. Complaints ranged from repeated dogs at large to owners allowing their dogs to leave piles in neighboring yards. The Sheriff's department has helped tremendously with logging our complaints, and following up on complaints. All valid complaints are being sent to the Sheriff's office. Community members are being asked to provide photos, dates, times, names, and addresses in order for the complaint to be filed.

**Animal Control / Licensing:**

- Salmon River Mobile Vet held a clinic at City Hall on Saturday, April 16<sup>th</sup> at 9am. They had a full day, and we closed up around 5pm. Six dog licenses were sold during the clinic. This year, 26 licenses have been sold, compared to 27 licenses in 2021.

**Other Projects:**

- Baseball – T-Ball: We have over 40 players signed up for baseball and T-ball this year. Jessie Wallace and Shawndale Howard have volunteered to coach the three teams. Practices will start Monday, May 9<sup>th</sup>, and will run through the end of June. All of our sponsorships are filled, with YAC, Perpetua, and an anonymous sponsor sponsoring our teams.
