



RANKED CHOICE VOTING COUNTING GUIDE

In all state and federal general elections, WHAT voters rank candidates in order of preference, instead of only choosing one.

Ballots are counted in rounds. If a candidate gets 50% + 1 vote in round one, they win. HOW Candidates are eliminated until two candidates remain and the candidate with the most votes wins.

ROUND 1

Only your 1st choice ranking is counted.

If a candidate gets 50% + 1 vote, they win.

If not, the counting goes to Round 2.



ROUND 2

The candidate with the fewest votes gets eliminated.

If you voted for that candidate, your vote goes to your next choice and you still have a say in who wins.


If more than two candidates are left, counting continues.



ROUND 3 (and beyond)

The candidate with the most votes wins.

If two candidates are left, the candidate with the most votes wins.
